Seattle, Wash., Nov. 29.—Dr. B. F. Roller, wrestler-physician, who has achieved considerable local newspaper notoriety of an unenviable character, has reconsidered his decision to devote the winter to wrestling, and has resurrected his old ambition to become a pugilist. According to an announcement today, Tommy Ryan, the veteran middleweight boxer, has taken Dr. Roller under his tutelage, and declares that the Seattle physician has the making of a fighter. Roller, who is at present at Mount Clemens, Mich., intends, he says, to devote himself to the ring game exclusively after the Christmas holidays, and he will have Ryan as a steady boxing partner. After several months of preparation, Riller will matched with one of the secondary heavyweight scrappers for a try-out.

It is to Ryan's coaching that Jim Jeffries owes his boxing science.

and the "contributory negligence" features.  
Another suggestion was for an appropriation to pay inspectors to enforce the child labor law in the District of Columbia.  
The interview with the president is said to have been very satisfactory and it is expected that some of the recommendations will be included in the president's forthcoming message.  
It is reported, however, that Taft has come to the conclusion not to recommend any detailed change in the Sherman law at this time, because a number of important cases are due for decision by the supreme court, which will involve interpretations of the law.

### Final Appeal Is Filed.

Washington, Nov. 29.—In behalf of President Samuel Gompers, Vice-President Mitchell and Secretary Morison, of the American Federation of Labor, Judge Alton B. Parker today filed a final appeal to the supreme court of the United States from the decision of the supreme court of the District of Columbia ordering the labor leaders jailed for violating an injunction.

Each of the three defendants was present when Judge Parker filed the motion.

session of the California legislature the passage of measures concerning the foreign proprietorship of lands, which was regarded as being inspired by an anti-Japanese sentiment. Zamoto believes the proposed changes in the Japanese laws will have a significant bearing in the framing of treaties between Japan and other powers. He said:

"It is a matter to be dealt with first by treaty; A treaty understanding naturally takes precedence over all laws, and after that has been per-

fecting the laws of the nation may be changed by the parliament.

"Ever since the days of isolation we have been taught to believe that the foreign or Occidental world sought to obtain supremacy by gaining possession of the public lands. Consequently we have been somewhat conservative in our ideas of the administration of lands. We do not permit aliens to own our lands, but we do permit them to use the surface soil for almost any purpose, under lease, which may be extended over a term of 999 years. I believe that by permitting foreigners to own land in our country the nation would derive many advantages, and I have been unable to appreciate under what conditions such an agreement would prove derogatory to us."
