BOOSTERS ANNUAL MEETING

Election of Officers and Report of Work Done for the Year Last Past.

The annual meeting of the Salem Board of Trade brought out a large attendance. President McNary presided. The secretary's report showed an overdraft of \$323.60. December collections would show a neat balance in the treasury. Pieces of mail sent out for the month of November, 5,964. Financial report was read for year ending December 1, 1909:

Receipts \$ 9,717.84
Disbursements 10,933.72
There was a balance on hand at beginning of year of nearly a thousand dollars.

Statistical report of Secretary Hofer showed \$617,000 increase in bank deposits, increase in postal receipts, \$7,826; school census shows gain of 443; increase in teachers, 8; telephones increase, 560; new buildings gain, 416; curb improvements increase are \$1,400,000. Property sold to new-comers during past year amounts to \$1,723,211.

One Salem real estate firm reported selling 175,000 to new-comers, besides local sales. Two Salem real estate firms sold \$106,000 worth of property the past year.

Election of Officers.
Report of nominating committee was read as follows:

For president—T. B. Kay.
For vice-president—M. O. Buren.
For secretary—A. F. Hofer.
For treasurer—D. J. Fry.
For executive committee—Jos. H. Albert, R. C. Bishop, F. G. Deckebach, J. R. Linn, W. T. Stolz.
The above slate was chosen by A. Huckestein, R. C. Bishop, Paul B. Wallace, A. A. Lee, W. I. Staley.
G. Stolz moved that report be adopted.

Mr. Baisey opposed adoption, and offered to make a nomination.

Mr. Huckestein and J. H. Albert spoke for the report of the nominating committee. He made the point that adopting this report only placed the names in nomination, that they should be elected by ballot.

The report was adopted. Mr. Baisey nominated J. A. Mills for secretary.

The election of T. B. Kay for president was made by acclamation. The rest of the ticket was elected in similar manner, and a ballot on secretary resulted as follows:

Hofer 46
Mills 35

Secretary Hofer was declared re-elected, and the vote was made unanimous.

Mr. McNary made a few graceful remarks in retiring, and introduced his successor, Hon. T. B. Kay, who was received with great applause. He accepted the position with a keen sense of appreciation and paid his predecessor a high compliment. He reviewed the conditions of the past, contrasted with the progressive spirit of the present. In three years property values had doubled. Paving streets had added double the cost to the value of property and to rents. What was most needed was mountain water, and it would do more to make this a great city. (Great applause.) We had the reputation of having poor water, and could not get away from it. Nothing would add so much population or do so much to insure the future of this city as mountain water. Next to mountain water we needed a hotel. A syndicate had bought the old Willamette, had plans drawn and would make it a modern house. There was business for it,

and for half a dozen smaller hotels. We also needed more factories, and another railroad or two. By 1912 we would have 35,000 people, and in five years 50,000, if we did our part to get first-class water, hotels and factories. (Applause.) He made a strong plea for a mutual pull for a greater Salem.

M. O. Buren, as the next officer, returned his thanks for the honor. He recommended more liberal use of paint in erecting signs on their buildings, to tell what they are. He pleaded for standing shoulder to shoulder in all the work of the board.

Mr. Stolz spoke of progress in street improvement, provisions for more sewers, for better parks. He spoke of the need of better parkings along the street. He favored a special committee of ten on civic improvements.

Dr. Epply made a plea for more adequate quarters for the Board of Trade. There should be a social center where business men could meet at lunch. Charles Dick tried to get J. R. Linn on his feet, and to his chagrin failed to get a rise for a speech from that direction.

The board adjourned after one of the most interesting profitable meetings in its history.

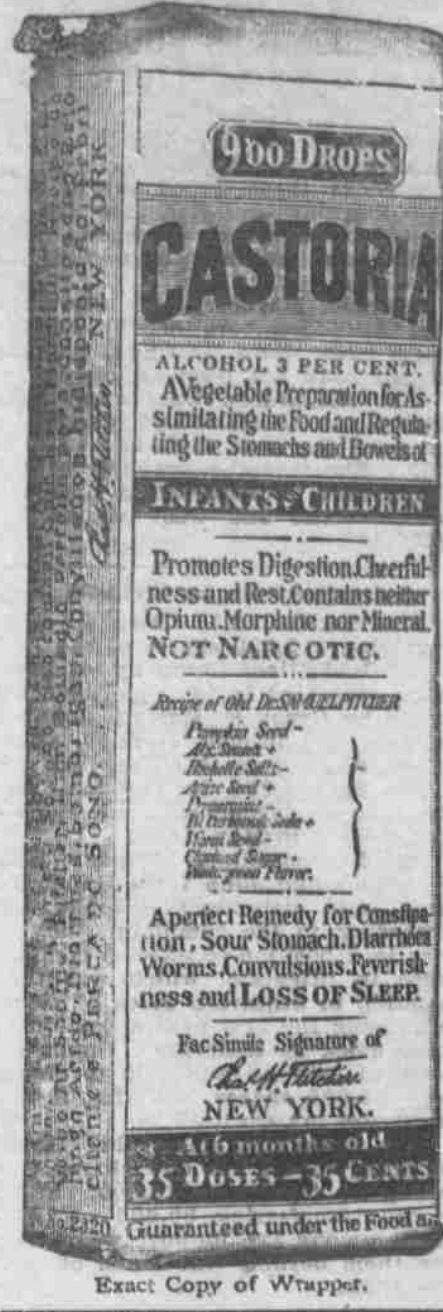
