A Remarkable Memory.

An article in the St. Louis Globe-Democrat by E. J. Edwards tells a most remarkable story of a lawsuit between the United Sttes and Mexico, wherein Mexico, with Caleb Cushing as advocate expected to secure millions of indemnity from our government for the incursions of Indians on her soil.
