

IS KILLED ON ENTERING THEATER

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.]

Bombay, India, Dec. 22.—The police are working today on the theory that the assassination last night of A. M. T. Jackson, the administrative head of the important city of Nasik, who was shot to death in the lobby of a Bombay theater, was the direct result of a wide-spread plot to murder English officials. The assassin, a native, boasted of his deed when arrested.

Jackson was entering the theatre with two young women when the native approached and fired without a word. The official fell, mortally wounded, dying a few hours later.

The wide-spread attempts to assassinate English officials during the last six months has aroused the government here and at home to act, and the hotbeds of discontented Indians are being constantly raided.

Colonel Wyllie, for years an official in Bombay, was recently murdered in London by an Indian student, who declared on the day of his execution that his country's deliverance rested in the hands of assassins.

Viceroy Minto and his wife were victims of a bomb thrower November 13, and numerous attempts have been made to kill Lord Kitchener and Sir Andrew Frazier, the lieutenant-governor of Bengal.

Other high officials have had narrow escapes.

Last February a bomb was thrown at a train standing in the station at Barrackpore. It developed later that the assassins believed Lord and Lady Minto were aboard.

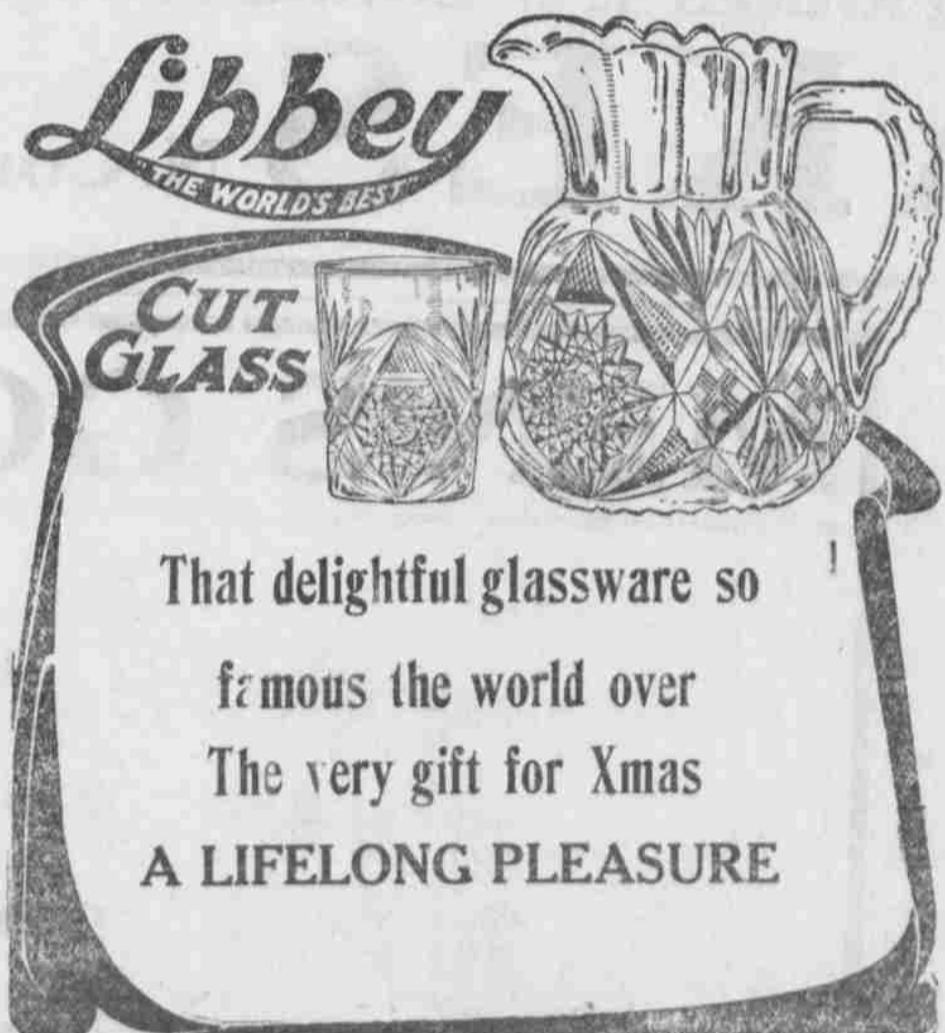
