UMATILLA COUNTY MUST PAY DETECTIVES

By a decision handed down by Judge Bean, of Umatilla county the county will be forced to pay the bill, amounting to \$356, due for the services rendered by a Portland detective, who was employed by District Attorney G. W. Phelps more than a year ago to investigate the violations of the liquor law in this city, and as a result of such investigation, a large number of indictments were returned by the grand jury, which eventually caused the levying of fines aggregating more than \$7,000, many of the men indicted at that time pleading guilty to the charge.

After the work was all done, the detective presented his bill for \$356, but the county court turned it down, because Commissioners Lee and Walker said they had not been consulted in the matter. The decision avers that the district attorney had a right to employ a man to investigate conditions which could not otherwise be determined.
