NORTH YAKIMA REMAINS WET

Number of Ballots Cast Only Sixty Short of Total Registration.

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] North Yakima, Wash., Dec. 31.—In an election characterized by a heavy vote and an intense interest, North Yakima voted to remain in the "wet" column today by a majority of 270 votes. The prohibition forces failed to carry a single precinct in the city, and it was evidenced that the result represented the true sentiment of the city by the fact that out of the 2600 electors registered, 2640 cast their votes. Though the police were on hand to see that there was no disorder, their presence was not needed, as there was not the slightest attempt at roughness or rowdiness.

The election terminated a long and bitter campaign, started before the city primary fight was on, and later curiously intermixed with local politics. In the wind-up of the struggle today the "wets" pressed into service every automobile in the city, while the "drys" made free use of hacks, and further increased their efforts at the polls by having women mingle among the crowds, bearing banners urging the men to vote against license.
