CELEBRATED FIFTY-FIRST ANNIVERSARY

The Burns Club of Salem Was Organized Last Night.

The one hundred and fifty-first anniversary of Scotland's poet, Robert Burns, was celebrated with songs and readings from the poet's writings and also remarks upon his writings and life by prominent men entering into the composition of Salem's business and professional circles.

Prior to the rendition of the program a committee on permanent organization reported and a constitution and by-laws and officers were elected. John Bayne was elected president and H. P. D'Arcy was elected vice president and Wm. McGilchrist was elected secretary and treasurer.

The program opened with the song, "The Lee Rig" which was rendered by Wm. McGilchrist, and then followed remarks of five minutes duration by Judge Webster, Hon. John Minto, P. H. D'Arcy, Judge Galloway, C. L. McNary, P. J. Miles, A. N. Moores and H. S. Polwal. Then came the songs, "Highland Mary" and "Bonnie Doonee" by Mr. Minto, which were effectively rendered and following them came a reading of the "Cotter's Saturday Night" by Geo. A. Shand. Mrs. James Hunter gave a pleasing rendition of the song "Jessie's Dreams" and Wm. McGilchrist gave a delightful reading of Tam O'Shanter. John Bayne read Burns' address, "To a Louse" and also his address, "To a Daisy." Wm. McGilchrist sang four of the poet's favorite songs, "Bonnie Mary of Argyle," "Afton Waters," "She Is My Daisy" and "I Love a Lassie." The program came to a close with the audience singing "Auld Lang Syne."

Despite the fact that the night was rainy and stormy the celebration was well attended.

COTTAGE GROVE BOY WINS MEDAL

At the Annual Alumni Medal debate and tryout for the inter-state debating teams held at Villard hall, University of Oregon, at Eugene last Saturday evening, Carleton E. Spencer, a freshman from Cottage Grove, Oregon, and graduate of the Roseburg High School, won the alumni medal for the best individual debater. Spencer was a member of the Oregon team which last week unanimously defeated the University of Utah, and he formerly debated in the Oregon High School Debating League. Eight men participated in the contest last night, which was also the final tryout to select the inter-state debating teams against Washington and Idaho, as the following were chosen: Percy Collier, '11, of Eugene; Carleton E. Spencer, '13, of Cottage Grove; Leon Ray, '12, of Eugene; Howard Zimmerman, '13, of Salem; Burleigh Cash, '12, of Hood River; and Burns Powell, '12, of Portland. The arrangement of the men on the teams is left to the debating coach.

CONSIDERED A PIPE DREAM

Only Interest Shown in New State Scheme is at Yreka, California.

San Francisco, Cal., Jan. 26.—Lack of enthusiasm over the project of creating a new state of Siskiyou from a combination of the northern counties of California and the southern counties of Oregon is indicated by dispatches received here today. Not only is there apparent apathy, but in some counties there appears to be a general sentiment against the plan.

The strongest support accorded to the scheme appears to come from Yreka, in Siskiyou county, which town would make a bid for the capital. Opposition to the plan is expressed in dispatches from Redding, Shasta county, and from Eureka, in Humboldt county, both of which were planned to be included in the new state. Besides the foregoing counties, the backers of the new state plans were to include Del Norte, Modoc, Lassan and Trinity counties, in California and seven counties in Oregon.

Scheme Originated With Boomers. Redding, Cal., Jan. 26.—There is no liability of an alliance of the northern and southern portions of California and Oregon, respectively, for the formation of a new state, according to citizens here today.

The general impression is that the scheme originated with Siskiyou boomers, who issued a map to show the purported advantages of the plan. There is no talk or agitation on the question here at present.

MEDFORD FAVORS NEW STATE

The Movement Heartily Endorsed by the Commercial Club of that City.

Medford, Ore., Jan. 26.—Local leaders in the movement to create a new state out of Northern California and Southern Oregon, when shown dispatches from California unfavorable to the project, today stated that as soon as possible they would start an active campaign to call attention to the advantages to be derived from the creation of the new state.

The movement originated in Medford some months ago, and has since been endorsed by many commercial bodies and men in all walks of life. It was brought about through the seeming inability of the territory embraced in the new state to secure any recognition by either state or national legislative bodies. Northern California, it is claimed, has long been neglected, while Southern Oregon says it is impossible to get a national appropriation for any part of the state that does not border on the Columbia river.

At the meeting of the Medford Commercial Club, the largest body of its kind in Oregon, outside of Portland, a mention of the proposed new state brought about a wild demonstration on the part of the 800 men present, which lasted many minutes. Local leaders in the movement are claiming today that the sentiment expressed at this representative gathering is universal throughout Southern Oregon.

ORGANIZING AT YREKA.

Proposition to Make New State Will Be Boosted Here.

Yreka, Cal., Jan. 26.—The movement to make a new state to be called Siskiyou, out of 14 counties, half in northern California and half in Oregon, comprising the richest part of the Pacific coast, is growing today.

Yreka, the county seat of Siskiyou, is favored for the capital of the projected commonwealth. The proposed name of the state is to be Siskiyou, and organizations are being formed to "boost" the proposition along.

Great interest is being manifested by citizens here. A full-page map of the new "state" has been printed and copies are being sent broadcast over the adjacent country.

Humboldt County Opposes It. Eureka, Cal., Jan. 26.—The people of Humboldt county are a unit in opposition to the formation of the state of Siskiyou, according to sentiment expressed here today.

Campaign along these lines finds absolutely no support in this county. The people of Humboldt are Californians, and will continue to remain so.
