Will Go to Albany—  
Attorney General Crawford and the railroad commission will leave Monday for Albany where the case of the state against the Corvallis & Eastern Railroad will be heard in the Linn county circuit court. The state has brought action against the C. & E. Company to penalize them for failing to comply with an order of the commission to erect a depot at Lyons, Oregon. The railroad commission issued an order several months ago on the Corvallis & Eastern railroad company but the order has been ignored, thus subjecting the company to a penalty of from \$500 to \$10,000. The suit is being brought under Section 53, Chapter 53, of the laws of 1907.

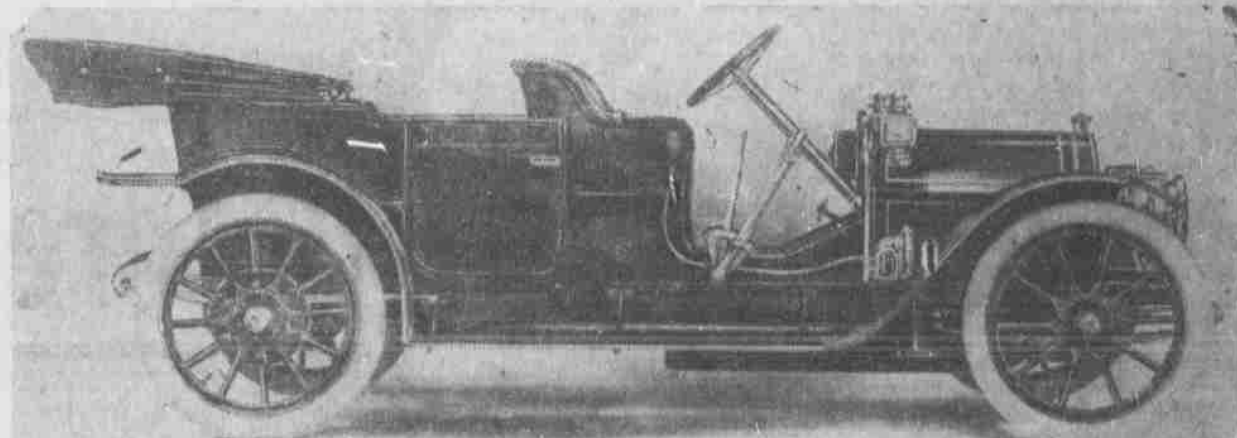
