HETTY GREEN GIVES HALF A MILLION

New York, March 17.—Mrs. Hetty Green will indirectly make New York City an Easter offer valued at \$500,000, according to Miss T. Brizzi, director of studies at the Christopher Columbus University today.

Miss Brizzi said that Mrs. Green intends to give Countess Leary a large plot of ground on Fifth avenue, near Central Park and the Museum of Art, to enable the countess to carry out her plan for a memorial to Christopher Columbus.

The memorial is to be a free university of art, where students are to be taught the higher handicrafts with out cost to themselves.

The university was started by Countess Leary three years ago, and now occupies five houses on Charlton street.

According to Miss Brizzi, the land to be given by Countess Leary will front Fifth avenue for a block, and on it a great palace of art is to be constructed.

Miss Brizzi said that she expected it would be a year before construction of the new buildings would be completed.
