THE WOMEN CALL IT A VICTORY

London, March 17.—Winston Churchill's advocacy of a plan to modify English prison regulations affecting women is accepted today by suffragists as a veritable victory for their cause. They see in his championship of a less rigorous prison regime a step toward the accomplishment of their campaign against the treatment of their members who are jailed for participation in public demonstrations.

"Henceforth suffragists who have gone to jail have been treated like depraved criminals," said Miss Christobel Fankhurst today. "They have been insulted, humiliated and heaped with indignities. Mr. Churchill's manly declaration is a step toward the better. I predict a better sentiment concerning our sisters as the result."

"At any rate, we will never have to get on our knees to scrub jail corridors again, and we fervently hope we won't be forced to eat as are recalcitrant swine."
