CONCERNING THE TAXING OF **ALL INCOMES**

In view of the fact that the resoations relative to the adoption of the proposed amendment to the constituion of the United States permitting the taxing of incomes will come up for consideration the first of next week by the legislature the State Tax Commission today prepared recommendations in relation to the measure which will be submitted to both nouses when the amendment comes up or action.

The amendment reads: "Congress shall have power to lovy and collect. taxes on incomes from whatever ource derived without apportionment among the several states, and without regard to any census or enumeration." The commission says that there are two reisons urged against the adoption of the amendmentthat it would permit the levying of a tax on incomes derived from state. county and municipal indebtedness, making it possible to indirectly tax a state, county or municipality, and that the taxes on incomes should be eserved as a source of revenue for the state, and be levied by the several


