

## MEET AND DISCUSS PAVEMENT

### PROPERTY OWNERS TALK WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE COMPANIES SUBMITTING BIDS FOR STREET PAVING.

With the view of securing the best possible proposals from the various companies who are desirous of securing contracts for the paving of a number of the city's streets, the street committee, together with Mayor Lachmund, and a number of property owners owning property on the streets in question, met this forenoon at the city hall with the representatives of the companies, and discussed the proposals made.

The companies submitting proposals were the Warren Construction Company; South Portland Crushed Rock Company; Clark & Henry, of Sacramento; the American Pavement Company; Universal Construction Company; Federal Construction Company, all of this city; and the Pacific Coast Westrumite Company, of Portland. The street committee, together with Engineer Skelton, held a meeting with the representatives of the company Saturday, but with the view of securing further concessions, as above stated, another meeting was held this forenoon.

All of the companies submitting their bids stood by the proposals made at the first meeting, but the Warren Construction Company. That company bid \$1.85 per square yard, but would make no guarantee. It was the opinion of the street committee and the other citizens assembled that the company should make a guarantee, and, after the subject was discussed at length, Mr. Shannon, in behalf of the company, agreed to furnish with the bid a guarantee of five years without cost to the city. No action was taken by the committee, but the matter will be referred to the council for final action.

## GOOD ROADS CHAMPIONS TUESDAY

### ARE REUF STANDS CHANCE TO GET A NEW TRIAL

San Francisco, Jan. 23.—The state supreme court today ordered a rehearing before the appellate court of the plea of Abraham Reuf for a new trial on the indictment under which he was convicted of bribery and sentenced to 14 years at San Quentin. The indictment was brought in the "trolley" case, and was tried before Superior Judge Lawler. Reuf was convicted in November, 1907, and since then has had his case on appeal. The appeal was denied by the appellate court eight months ago.

### SMALL STATES HAVE UNITED AGAINST TURKS

Vienna, Jan. 23.—Information reached the foreign office here today that Serbia, Montenegro, Bulgaria, Roumania and Greece have joined forces to curb Turkish aggression in the Balkans. A subsidy of \$5,000,000 has been guaranteed by the Serbian government to support a guerilla warfare along the Turkish frontier the Serbian bands working in conjunction with the Montenegrins.

### DISASTROUS FIRE IN AN OMAHA HOTEL

Omaha, Neb., Jan. 23.—One man is dead and five others are in a serious condition as the result of a disastrous fire in the Millard hotel here today. The dead are: Thomas J. Fields, Sioux City, suffocated. Three hundred guests were asleep in the hotel, and there were many thrilling rescues. The property loss was \$10,000.

## THE EQUITY COURT IS CONVENED

### JUDGE GALLOWAY OPENS COURT THIS MORNING WITH 85 CASES ON THE DOCKET—AFTERNOON DEVOTED TO MOTIONS.

Judge Galloway arrived in the city today and this afternoon convened the equity department of the circuit court. There are in all on the calendar 85 cases and the session promises to be a lengthy one. The afternoon was consumed by the judge in listening to motions and preliminary pleas and the trying of cases in earnest will probably commence tomorrow.

The law department which is presided over by Judge Kelly, will convene again February 6, and the jury has been instructed to report for duty on that day. The first case to be tried is that of George Myers and following upon its heels will come the case of Thomas O'Rourke.

### NEW YORK WANTS EXPOSITION ON PACIFIC

## LODGE MAY YET RIVAL LORIMER

### THE FACT THAT TWO DEMOCRATS BROKE THE DEADLOCK AND ELECTED THE BIG STANPATER, MAKES DEMOCRATIC PROSECUTOR GET BUSY.

Boston, Mass., Jan. 23.—Charges that corruption and vote-buying entered into the re-election last week of United States Senator Henry Cabot Lodge are to be investigated, District Attorney Pelletier, of Suffolk county, today started the probe. When Lodge apparently deadlocked at the end of a bitter struggle in the legislature the vote of two Democrats eased him through the tight corner. Rumors that all was not clear started as soon as the votes were cast, and today's investigation by a Democratic district attorney may, it is said, mean before it is ended, that Massachusetts will have a case to parallel the Lorimer disclosures in Illinois.

### HUNDREDS ATTEND TO PAY TRIBUTE OF AFFECTION

The funeral of the late Joshua Smith, who was a victim of the recent big storm, took place from the Unitarian church Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The services were held under the auspices of the Grand Army, of which he was an honored member, and of the Odd Fellows, and, though simple, were impressive. Two past commanders, Mr. Hillis, of Bridal Home, and Col. Pike, of Newberg, were present, as were a large number of the members of the Grand

Army, and also a great gathering of Odd Fellows. The big church was crowded to its capacity, and floral tributes were many and beautiful. Interment was in the Grand Army Circle at City View cemetery, with appropriate services by both the Grand Army and Odd Fellows, in both of which orders he was held in high esteem, as indeed he was by all who knew him.

## THE SCHENK TRIAL IS AT AN END

### ALL THAT REMAINS IS THE ARGUMENTS, THE COURTS INSTRUCTION—AND OF COURSE THE VERDICT.

Wheeling, W. Va., Jan. 23.—Heavy blows were dealt today by Judge Jordan to the defense of Mrs. Laura F. Schenk to the accusation of poisoning her rich husband. Judge Jordan, on motion the state, struck out of the case the testimony of two important witnesses, whose evidence was designed to show that the Schenk family conspired for the defendant's downfall.

After the court's ruling the state rested at 10:12 o'clock, offering no evidence in rebuttal. Arguments in the case will begin this afternoon.

Through evidence that Mrs. Schenk had stated that the Rev. George Way, a spiritualist pastor, had predicted Schenk's death, deputy sheriffs today are seeking Way with warrants for his arrest as a fortune teller. It is said Way has fled the state.

## UNCLE JOE'S FOLKS MUST COME TO TAW

### PROBE WILL GO DEEP AND SEVERAL THOUSAND VOTERS WILL PROBABLY CONFESS TO BRIBING OR BEING BRIBED.

Danville, Ill., Jan. 23.—Official probing into alleged wholesale vote buying in Vermillion county, "Uncle Joe" Cannon's bailiwick, was started today by the grand jury. Wholesale confessions are expected to follow.

Hundreds of bankers and politicians have been summoned, including every candidate for office in recent years. It is understood that these candidates will be required to furnish an itemized statement of their campaign expenses.

When the names of those who were to testify were called, a count of noses showed that a number of prominent men had suddenly "been called out of the state on business."

R. H. Frankenberger, a reporter who secured the alleged confession from City Attorney Frank Jones, and which Jones repudiated was the first witness. Jones has announced his willingness to testify.

It is alleged that a number of prominent witnesses are trying to block the investigation.

### SENT TO THE PEN FOR ATTEMPTING SUICIDE

Tacoma, Wash., Jan. 23.—Charged with attempting to commit suicide, Charles Dalling pleaded guilty today before Judge Chapman.

He told the judge that he was disgusted with life. Dalling was offered the choice of a year in the reformatory or a year in the state penitentiary at Walla Walla. He chose Walla Walla.

This is the first conviction under the recently enacted state anti-suicide law.

### IDAHO TO BUILD \$2,000,000 CAPITOL

Boise, Ida., Jan. 23.—In response to a resolution of inquiry from the senate today Governor Hawley reported today that the cost of Idaho's new capitol building will be \$2,000,000. An appropriation sufficient to complete the main section of the building in the next two years will be asked for.
