# ARE FACING LONG TERM IN PRISON

### CHIEF HAMILTON AND DAY OFFICER BURKHARDT SECURES CONFESSIONS FROM PRISONERS TO RUIN A YOUNG GIRL.

Convinced that Charles Rapp, who was arrested by Day Officer Burkhardt and Night Patrolman Whitlatch on the charge of stealing a bicycle was guilty of a graver offense—that of luring young girls to his tent on the banks of the Willamette river, and sustaining immoral relations with them, Chief of Police Hamilton and Day Officer Burkhardt yesterday afternoon cleverly drew from him a confession, which not only involved himself, but entangled Roy Williamson in the meshes of the law for a similar offense, and both were bound over this morning by Judge Elgin to the grand jury under a bond of \$50 each.

After Rapp was arrested for stealing the bicycle he strenuously denied being guilty. Day Officer Burkhardt, however, decided to investigate and gather evidence against him, and when he denied his guilt again, confronted him with indisputable proof, with the result that he confessed. Chief Hamilton and Day Officer Burkhardt also suspected him of having been intimate with girls under the statutory age, and, springing what little evidence they had along this line they drew from him a confession that he had been intimate with a young girl, whose name we withhold, who is but 15 years of age.

**Girl Involves Williamson.**  
Confronting the girl with his confession, she admitted the truth of it, and, upon being further interrogated, she admitted to having had immoral relations with Roy Williamson. Taking her confession they managed to secure one from him, and his arrest followed.

Rapp lived in a tent near the river bank, and he prevailed upon the girl to come and visit him there, while Williamson had her come to his room. Both being arraigned this morning waived their examination. In addition to the \$500 bond, Judge Elgin placed Rapp under a \$200 bond for the stealing of the bicycle. Neither had furnished bonds late this afternoon.

The penalty of the offense with which they are charged is from three to 20 years in the state prison.

his tier are gathered the governor and other state officials with many of the leading citizens of his adopted state; all mourning the loss of one who for more than 40 years has been the foremost resident of Oregon. I say resident advisedly for the deceased soldier, jurist and statesman, who lies before us cold in death, was too big a man to be claimed exclusively by any one state. Rather he was a resident of Oregon and a citizen of the United States.

Though unworthy, yet it is meet that a pioneer and one who was a student of the old pioneer university when the deceased first came to this city and one who has known him intimately for two score years and has learned to love and honor him for his nobility of character and high standard of manhood, should say a few words on this occasion as to his character and life.

Judge Lord was of Southern parentage and in early life was a Jacksonian Democrat as was his father before him, but his service as a soldier in the Civil War and his intimate acquaintance and association with Lincoln and other founders of the Republican party induced him to become associated with that party, but in no sense was he a partisan when the welfare of his country was at stake.

### CENSUS CUTS DOWN PORTLAND'S POPULATION

(UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE)  
Washington, Feb. 21.—The population of Seattle, Spokane, Portland and San Francisco were considerably reduced over first estimates today when the final counts were given out by Chief Durand of the census bureau.

"Padding, overcounting, deliberate conspiracies and unintentional mistakes have tended to complicate the determining of the correct population in various cities," said Chief Durand in a bulletin issued today.

The corrected totals of the following cities were given out:

Seattle 337,194, previously announced as 248,382; Spokane 104,402, given as 109,895; Portland 207,214, previously announced as 222,953; San Francisco 416,912, given as 420,214; Bellingham, reduced from 27,194 to 24,298, and Aberdeen from 15,598 to 13,950.

The population of Minneapolis was reduced from 306,078 to 301,408, and Boise, Idaho, from 19,782 to 17,358.

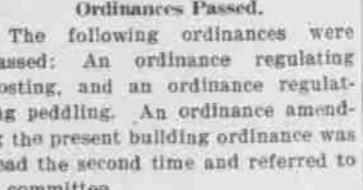
