#### GOVERNOR **APPROVES** SOME BILLS

Believing tha tthe raising of coun. y salaries is a matter for the people to pass judgment upon, and in view of the fact that most of the measures passed by the legislature raising the salaries of county officials provide that they shall be referred to the people, or are so drawn that the people can apply the referendum to them, if they desire. West this morning approved all the bills raising the salaries of officials in the counties of the state.

There are 22 of these measures

in all, and they provided for the raising of salaries of every kind of an official, from constable up. None of the raises were large, however, and, because of this, and the further fact that it is a question which the governor thinks the people of the counties themselves should decide, and which they may decide for themselves by the use of the referendum, he has approved all the bills.
