## THE DEMAND FOR BEAUTIFUL TOWNSITE PROPERTY.

The strongest and most growing idea that gives value to real estate is the demand for more beautiful townsite additions. Look at the way people are snapping up the lots in Kingwood Park, because the site is planned with beauty as an asset. There has not been laid out around Salem a single beautiful addition on a large scale to make a desirable residence section on the lines of modern ideas of city building. Many years ago Frank Derby laid off Morningside for that purpose, but he was 15 years ahead of the times. But Salem has grown and expanded until there is nothing but inside property left, and the city is slopping over across the river.

Indications are that it will grow very fast in that direction, for the reason that taxes are low over there. The lectures to be given in this city by Howard Evarts Weed will awaken Salemites to their lost opportunities. The failure of this city to secure Fairmount Park for a public recreation park was a downright disgrace. There are still other beauty spots left that should be taken over by the city before it is too late.

## THE COUNTRY WILL BE SAVED.

When the politicians cannot do anything else they have the public school children parade. The news comes that Gifford Pinchot endorses the Boy Scouts, and there is great rejoicing among the lollypops. The great army of aristocracy that is multiplying under national paternalism is marching on—with the Boy Scouts. Poor, innocent Boy Scouts, ye know not to what base uses you are put to by the predatory looters of the national government. More departments, more officials, more bureaus, thousands of new clerks and parasites created at each session of congress. Congressman Hawley, who was a very good history teacher in the days of the old Salem Institute, helps along the game. The pauperizing processes that are swallowing up the earnings of the people to expand officialism are immense. ## ONLY THE RECALL WILL STOP DAWDLING AWAY THE PUBLIC REVENUES.

The Capital Journal has voiced a protest against the two per cent gross earnings corporation tax being stipulated away by "implication." Of course, the people do not know how it was done, but some official did it, and it has been done, and the tax voted by the people has been nullified. Instead of \$250,000 to \$500,000 indirect taxes being collected from great trusts and untaxed corporations, this sum must be raised by a direct tax on land. President Taft rejoices that the supreme court of the United States has upheld the corporation gross earnings tax that will be putting \$25,000,000 a year into Uncle Sam's cash box. In Oregon the supreme court has upheld this tax law enacted by the people, and the supreme court of the United States will enact it if they ever reach the case. But by "implication" the official representatives of the trusts who masquerade before the people as "Republicans" have repealed the gross earnings tax enacted by the people. Why doth not the great and mighty state grange get up and howl at this outrage committed in Oregon against the power of the people under direct legislation? Shall their baby be strangled in its cradle before it ever got onto its feet, and nobody even be called down for the outrage? The gang has found ways to set aside the fruits of the initiative and referendum, and nobody seems to even peep. Shall we not even hear a peep from the lawgiver at Oregon City, and will he not investigate and apply the recall to the criminal who has diddled away at least a quarter of a million of revenues?

## MEXICO'S INTIMACY WITH JAPAN

THIS ENGLAND THINKS IS THE CAUSE OF SENDING ARMY TO THE BORDER—DIAZ FRIENDLY BUT UNABLE TO CONTROL SITUATION.

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] London, March 14.—Declaring that information based on the most authentic sources, Japanese friendship with Mexico is the real cause of American Army maneuvers, an American correspondent sends the following dispatch, which was printed in the Standard today:  
"Mexican intimacy with Japan is increasing to such an extent as to threaten America with the possibility of a flank attack in the event of war for the mastery of the Pacific. That is the real reason for the massing of the American army in Texas and California.

"The demonstration is a warning to Mexico and a notification to Japan that the United States will not tolerate the establishment of a pro-Mexican government. America is fully determined to go to any extreme to end the danger of Japanese using Mexico as a naval base for future operations against America. The situation could not be more serious."  
"This information comes from a source the authenticity of which is unquestioned."  
"There has been developing a strong anti-American feeling among certain leading Mexicans, causing them to foster the most cordial feeling for Japan, which the Japanese have encouraged."  
"There are thousands of Japanese residents in Mexico—some say 100,000. All would accept unhesitatingly military orders from Tokio, and there has been unearthed lately unmistakable evidence that eminent Mexicans, gradually obtaining a position where they can dictate Mexico's foreign policy, have become bolder in their willingness to ally themselves with Japan.

"Some have even carried their pro-Japanese proclivities to the extent of expressing a willingness to give Japan a naval base on the Mexican coast. The Japanese diplomats would not accept openly such a concession, knowing that so complete a violation of the Monroe doctrine would lead to immediate war with the United States."  
"One of two eventualities must be the outcome. Either President Taft will be assured in a manner having no possibility of doubt that Mexico will cease her intimacy with Japan or the American army will enter Mexico, ostensibly to restore order and protect international commercial interests, but really to destroy utterly the power of those Mexicans whose hostility to the United States is seeking an outlet through Japanese channels.

"Diaz himself is friendly to the United States. He does not favor the development of the Japanese sentiment, but he is unable to control the situation."  
"The military preparations of the United States are more extensive than is generally known. Preliminary preparations have been made to concentrate the whole fighting strength against Mexico, should future developments make such a course necessary."

## MEXICANS HAD A REAL BATTLE WITH 21 KILLED

Huachuca, Ariz., March 13.—General Blanco declared today that the battle at Agua Prieta yesterday was merely a demonstration to determine the strength of the federal force, and that the real attack will begin today. An American physician, who attended the injured after the battle estimates the casualties at 21 killed and 15 wounded on the federal side, while the rebels lost only two men killed and three injured. The United States troops are lined up on the American side of the border, ready for any emergency.

## THE COUNCIL ORDERS MORE STREET PAVING

ASYLUM AVENUE AND TWENTY-FOURTH WITH BITULITHIC TWELFTH AND THIRTEENTH WILL BE PAVED WITH CONCRETE.

A resolution declaring the wooden shacks on the corner of State and Liberty streets to be in a decayed condition, covered with moss and offensive in appearance was introduced in the city council last evening and the matter referred to the street committee and the city attorney. The committee and the city attorney are instructed to interview the property owners and if possible reach an agreement with them whereby the ancient buildings will be removed. If it is not possible to reach such an agreement they are instructed to take proceedings looking to the condemnation of the buildings. The Capitol Trust company, of Portland, asked for the privilege of putting an electric line for lighting and power purposes across the Wilamette river bridge and it was granted.

**Street Improvement Launched.**  
The real launching of the street improvement for the season came when the council awarded contracts to the Warren Construction company for the paving with bitulithic of Asylum and Twenty-fourth street. The bid was \$1.85 a square yard and the company agrees to guarantee the work for a period of five years.

Judge Elgin was directed to advertise for bids for the paving of Twelfth street with concrete; Thirteenth street with the same kind of pavement and Summer street with Aleso. A resolution directing the construction of a sidewalk on Norway street was passed, and a resolution directing the building of a sidewalk along the Fair Ground road was referred to the committee on streets. The council adjourned to meet Monday evening.

## CHOLERA INCREASING IN THE ISLANDS

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Honolulu, March 14.—Another case of cholera made its appearance today among those who had been exposed to infection and are in quarantine. This makes 27 cases since the appearance of the diseases here. There have been 21 deaths.

## DYNAMITED BANK AND GOT \$50,000

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Canandaigua, N. Y., March 14.—Armed posses today are searching for men who last night dynamited the bank at Rushville, near here, and escaped with \$50,000. Details of the robbery have not been received.
