

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Bellingham, Wash., March 14 .--Persistent rumors are current in military circles to the effect that during the last month there has been an exodus of Japanese from the Pacific voast. From an outside source informa-

tion was given out in Bellingham recently that every city on the coast has experienced a marked decrease in its Japanese population. It is conceded that the emigration might be due to commercial conditions. The report was not based upon the large exodus of Japanese from Bellingham.


