### AN ATHLETIC CLUB IS NOW A CERTAINTY

That the city will have in the near future an Athletic club patterned after the Multnomah Athletic club is now assured, and those interested in the enterprise will celebrate their success with an opening at the Opera House Friday evening with one of the liveliest programs of sports that has ever been pulled off in the city.

Twenty thousand dollars is the sum needed for the launching of the club--that is, that will cover the purchase of a site and the erection of a building upon it and its equipment. So much has now been subscribed that the remainder is assured, and hence the celebration Friday evening. As soon as the required amount is secured articles of incorporation will be drawn, a board of directors elected, and negotiations begun for the site. Several local boys will show upon the program Friday evening in the way of boxing, and Gaines and Silverthorne promise something unusual in the fist line.

## GOVERNOR PUTS PRICE ON PROPERTY

### WHILE THE COMMITTEE FIXES THE PRICE AT \$10,000 THE GOVERNOR SAYS IT IS TOO MUCH AND OFFERS IT FOR \$8500.

Not \$10,000, but \$8500 is the price which Governor West wants for his share of the site lying just east from the capitol grounds, and which a committee has been negotiating for as a building site for the new building to be erected by the state for the supreme court and the library. The committee which has been negotiating for the property consists of State Treasurer Kay, President Ben Selling and Speaker Rusk, and they placed the value of West's share of the block at \$10,000, and criticized other property owners for holding their shares so high. Now the governor comes to the front, and goes them one better, by placing the value of his own property at \$8500, and fixing the value of the street improvements at \$2000, and that is the sum he wants for it, and not one red cent more.

The governor made the announcement after his return from the Sluslaw country last night.
