NORTH SALEM RESIDENCE IS BURNED

BUILDING OWNED BY M. A. NASH AND OCCUPIED BY M. CHRISTENSEN—NO WATER AVAILABLE OR FIRE COULD HAVE BEEN CONTROLLED.

An alarm of fire turned in this morning about 9:30 was caused by a blaze in North Salem at Front and Columbia streets, that completely destroyed a small residence building belonging to M. A. Nash, of the Red Front livery stable, and causing a loss of about \$1000.

THROW LIGHT ON THE RECENT LEGISLATURE

CARL SMITH AND H. P. EDWARD GET OUT A BOOK SHOWING THE MOTIVE, CAUSES AND INFLUENCES BEHIND LEGISLATION.

How members sent to the legislature almost forgot this duty, and devoted their time to petty politics and unimportant bills is told in a remarkable and straightforward way in a book just from the press at Portland, written by Carl Smith and H. P. Edward, legislative correspondents of the Oregon Journal.

Friends of popular government will find this book an important aid in sifting up the work of the members, for it teems with information concerning the way legislators on both sides lined up, and why. It gives the story of influences at work beneath the surface, with which people of the state could not otherwise be familiar, and those who read the book will be driven to ask "why was it never thought of before?"

A number of prominent legislators, Col. E. Hofer and Portland newspaper correspondents are contributors to the book. Speaker Rusk contributes some of the strongest criticisms of the session. Timothy Brownhill, the Yamhill Independent, is also outspoken. Representative Derby, of Hood River, and Col. Hofer agree in statements that the legislature is unnecessary, and that the people can more wisely make and repeal laws. Col. Hofer predicts that there may be one more legislature, and that the people will then wipe it out of existence.

While these articles are interesting, additional interest will attach to the story of important bills, with particular reference to the Bowerman faction and the corporation lobbies.

These are among the topics, each handled in a happy, straight-from-the-shoulder way: "The Speaker-ship Fight," "The Steiner Affair," "The Senate and the Oregon System," "What the Corporations Killed," "The Old Guard in the House," "The Flat Salary Bill" and other measures of state-wide interest.

THE CASKET COMPANY TO REBUILD

THE WILLAMETTE MANUFACTURING COMPANY LOOKING FOR A NEW SITE ON "THE LOOP," AND WILL ERECT BRICK BUILDING.

That the Willamette Manufacturing Company, which lost its building by fire last week, not only intends rebuilding, but that it is in search of a building site which will bring it nearer to the business section of the city, became known today, when it was learned that those entering into the composition of the company are considering two new sites.

The company owns the site upon which the old building stood, but it is not altogether satisfactory, as it is a considerable distance from the business portion of the city, and not on the line of any railroad. The company is anxious to secure a site on what is known as the loop of the various railroads here, and the two sites under consideration are located on it.

The building contemplated by the company is a concrete and brick structure, and it intends to modernly equip it in every respect. The company is the second largest manufacturing concern in the state.

SHE WANTS A DIVORCE FROM BOB

TRUCK MOTORS TO MOVE ORE FROM SANTIAM

R. F. SHIER, OF THE BLACK EAGLE MINE, WILL TRY OUT THE MACHINES AS TO THEIR ABILITY TO DELIVER ORES CHEAPLY.

The Thorpe auto truck is to be tried out in a line of service that may open up a large new field for its use. One of the trucks has been built for the Black Eagle mines, and will be used to haul ore from the mines to the C. & E. railway at Gates, a distance of 14 miles.

The machine was built especially for hauling heavy loads of ore over steep mountain roads and has 60 horse power engines, which is double that of the machines for ordinary street traffic. As the application of the auto truck to mining is experimental the machine will be given a thorough try-out in the service. Mr. Cabanna, the master mechanic of the truck company, will go with the truck and gather data from the machine in service for such modifications as may be needed to fit it for the new line of work.

Mr. R. F. Shier, of the Black Eagle Mining Company, was in the city Saturday in consultation with the truck company regarding the installing of the truck in the ore hauling service. If the trial truck proves the success fully anticipated by both the mining and truck companies, about 10 machines will be ordered and set to work hauling ore down from the mines.

The Black Eagle mines are a very promising property and offer an excellent proving ground for the Thorpe truck. If it makes good in the service and enables the company to get out their ore at a moderate transportation cost, the demand for the truck for ore hauling will be very great. Both sides of the Sierra Nevada-Cascade range, from British Columbia to Southern California are dotted with mineral veins that could be worked profitably. If transportation facilities could be installed at low cost. The try-out of the Thorpe truck will be watched with much interest.—Corvallis Tri-Weekly Republican.
