Nothing in the evidence offered shows any improper conduct by plaintiff toward Vandolah nor in her association with any other man; nor does it show visits by her to any improper place in Portland. On the contrary defendant testifies that he never knew of her being with any other man or anything of that kind; that she is a good and virtuous woman. Yet he made an ineffectual attempt at the trial to cast a cloud upon her good name.


