## BOURNE ASKS FOR MORE LAND FOR OREGON

Washington, April 21.—Senator Bourne yesterday introduced a bill granting Oregon an additional million acres of land for use under the Carey act. State Engineer Lewis is here to arrange with the Geographical Survey for co-operative work with the state in completing topographical surveys near Portland and extension surveys north from Eugene. He is also arranging with the Bureau of Soils of the Agricultural Department for soil surveys in Oregon.

#### PRESIDENT TAFT WILL DENY CHARGES

Washington, April 21.—It is understood that the cabinet today discussed charges that the Guggenheims had been allowed to seize the Chugach forest right of way to Controller Bay, leading from the Alaska coal fields, and that the administration's answer will be a general disclaimer of the charges. It is expected that President Taft will personally prepare the answer, and that it will deny the Guggenheims were granted a monopoly. It will contend that the officials of the Controller Bay railway swore that they had no connection with the Guggenheims.

Washington, April 21.—Victor L. Berger, Socialist congressman from Milwaukee, today presented a petition signed by 89,000 American citizens, demanding the recall of the United States troops from the Mexican border.

"This is a protest," said Berger, "that the bloody and tyrannical character of the Diaz government is understood and the justice of the uprising against him is appreciated by the majority of Americans."
