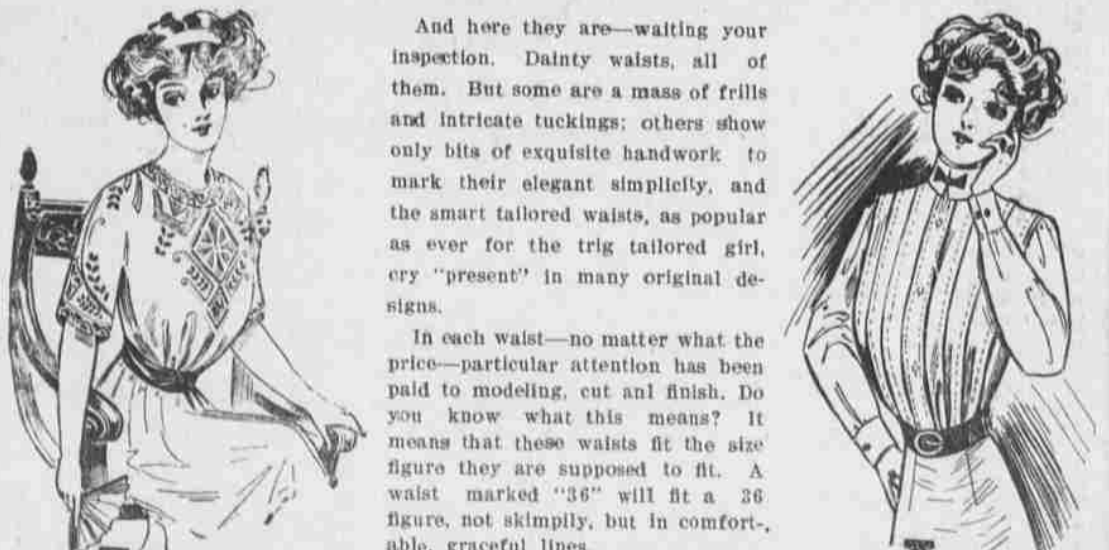

KILLED BY EXPLOSION OF GAS TANK

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Sacramento, Cal., April 29.—One man was killed and two fatally injured in the explosion of an acetylene gas tank this afternoon in the Southern Pacific shops.

Otto Hanson was killed, his body being torn to pieces. One arm was picked up 50 feet from the tank. Andrew Johnson will die from his injuries and J. Butcher is badly hurt.
