A New Way of Using Dates

By Mrs. Janet McKenzie Hill, Editor of the Boston Cooking School Magazine The value of dates as a food is hardly appreciated. They are wholesome, nutritious, and when used in K C Date Muffins, make a recipe that is appreciated by the entire family.
