## BE SURE AND SEE THE GREAT NETHERSOLE

ONE OF THE WORLD'S GREATEST ACTRESSES WILL BE AT THE GRAND TONIGHT—IF YOU FAIL TO SEE HER YOU WILL ALWAYS REGRET IT.

Olga Nethersole has added an interesting double bill to her repertory. She will be seen here on Wednesday, May 10, at the Grand Opera House in "Sister Beatrice" by Maurice Maeterlinck and "The Enigma" by Paul Hervieu.

Maeterlinck himself calls "Sister Beatrice" a miracle play. It might be more truly described as a dramatic poem. It is founded upon the legend of the medieval church. The scene is laid in a convent. Sister Beatrice is a nun to whom the temptation of worldly love has come in the person of Prince Belidor. In vain she prays to the sacred image of the Virgin to give her a sign as to whether it would be an unforgivable sin to steal away from the convent with her lover. The Virgin gives no sign and Sister Beatrice goes.

But hardly has the door closed behind her when the statue descends from its pedestal, and the Virgin takes the place of Sister Beatrice in the convent, assuming her dress and likeness.

The chant of the Virgin as her image comes down from its niche gives the explanation (if such there be) of the allegory—that no sin is unforgivable if committed in the name of Love.

For 20 years the Virgin takes the place of Sister Beatrice in the convent, but at the end of that time the former nun returns. She has been weak, she has fallen into the blackest depths of worldly sin. Aged and forsaken she has crept back to the convent to die—if the Sisters will permit her—at the foot of the Virgin's shrine. But, lo! the statue has returned to its long forsaken niche, and the nuns listen to Sister Beatrice's impassioned confession of guilt and plea for pardon with tender incredulity—for has she not been with them all the time?

This poem-play is told in Maeterlinck's loveliest and most imaginative vein, and takes rank in his work with "Pelleas and Melisande" and "The Blue Bird." "Sister Beatrice" is enhanced by a musical accompaniment written for the play by Herr Max Maxshalk. Miss Nethersole plays the dual part of Sister Beatrice and the Virgin, and she will also be seen in the leading role of "The Enigma" one of the cleverest plays in the repertory of the Comedie Francaise. left by the cheering followers of Blanco and Orozco, while every street which but a few minutes before had echoed to the crack of rifles and the hoarse shouts of fighting men, was vocal with the hurrahs of the victors and gay with their demonstrations of triumph.

El Paso, Tex., May 10.—General Navarro, commander of the Mexican federalists in Juarez, who had taken refuge in the barracks after Blanco's attack, surrendered this afternoon to General B. J. Viljoen, the Boer veteran. Colonel Tambourel was killed while fighting at the jail. The other

barracks, in which some volunteer defenders had taken refuge, also surrendered this afternoon, and were occupied by the rebels.

The insurgents are celebrating their victory this afternoon. All the bells in the city are ringing and the streets are filled with the shouting rebels.
