THE NUMBER KILLED WILL STAY UNKNOWN

El Paso, Tex., May 13.—While it probably never will be known with accuracy just how many perished in the three days' battle at Juarez, a count of the burials and an inspection of the hospitals completed today gave a fair idea of the casualties. The insurrecto loss is placed at 15 killed and 50 wounded, while 100 federal soldiers perished and 138 were wounded.

Provisional Governor Gonzales, of Chihuahua, says that 83 dead federales were picked up in the streets of Juarez after the last day's fight.

DARROW IS TO DEFEND M'NAMARAS

Los Angeles, Cal., May 13.—Clarence S. Darrow, chief counsel for the defense in the Moyer, Pettibone and Haywood trial, will arrive in Los Angeles to take up the defense of the McNameara brothers within the next 10 days.

The question as to his coming, which has been the subject of much comment in local circles, was settled definitely by a telegram received at the offices of Harriman and Ryckman at noon today. The telegram states: "Expect to start next week."

It is not known at the local headquarters of the defense whether a conference has been held between Darrow and Attorney Rappaport, who left for the East last week, taking with him a copy of the evidence given before the grand jury.

It is stated here that Rappaport went East with the intention of talking over the situation with Darrow. It is expected that Rappaport will not return before June 1, in time to be present for the plea on the arraignment which is set for that date. He may stay in the East and work on the case from that end while Darrow will take hold of the local situation and direct the operations of the defense from Los Angeles.
