

STANDARD COLLEGEGS or the purpose of preparing of the standard institutions learning in Oregon State Superin-tendent of Public Instruction Alderman, acting under a law passed by the last legislature, has asked that Board on the Standardization of

Colleges meet at his office May 22. It provides that the United States Bureau of Education shall determine what colleges shall be considered standard colleges, and in the event of its failure to act, a board, consist-ing of the president of the University of Oregon, the Oregon Agricultural College, the State Normal school, the superintendent of the Portland schools, one person to be selected by the Independent College Presidents' association and one to be selected from the Catholic Educational assoclation, shall meet and make a list of the standard colleges of the state. While the United States Bureau has not failed to act, its action will be delayed, and it is in view of this and the fact that there will be many graduate from the colleges of the state this spring, that action is now to be taken by the board.

STREET PAVEMENTS.

The Various Kinds in General Use Today Commented Upon and

(By Col. J. W. Howard, of New York the leading pavement expert of the

United States.) Macadam roadways are suited only for suburban and outlying districts. When in the interior of a town, they become dusty, muddy and quickly Macadam is the most expensive of all pavements to keep in repair, even under moderate conditions of weather and traffic. The tocluding first cost and maintenance, is generally greater than that of permanent pavements of other materials.

Bitulithic pavement is a form of bituminous pavement made with spec ial mixtures, prepared by special ma-chinery. Bitulithic practically con-sists in a foundation of either concrete or crushed stone cemented with a bituminous cement. Its wearing surface is a very dense mixture of graded, comminuted, crushed stone, etc; mixed with a bituminous cement This s a successful form of pavement which is durable, dense, slightly elastic and not slippery. It is suited to many streets and will sustain busi-ness traffic while at the same time it permits pleasure carriages and auto-mobiles to travel at fast speeds without slipping. Tar and Oil macadams are practi-
