Washington, May 27.—A trunkful of smuggled jewelry, valued at \$20. liam and Maude Rogers, which was confiscated by the San Francisco cus-toms officials, was today ordered re-leased by the officials of the United States treasury department, following representations that the gems were stolen in that country.

Rogers and his wife are now in custody, and will be held for the New Zealand officers, who will take them back to that country for trial. The jewelry will be returned with them as evidence in the case.
