TAFT MAY MAKE VISIT TO ASTORIA

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Washington, June 6.—President Taft today received an invitation from Astoria, Oregon, to visit that city during the centennial celebration next August of the founding of the town as a trading post by a member of the Astor family. The president has not yet indicated whether he will accept.

A summer home site on the shores of Lake Pen D'Oreille, in Idaho, has been tendered the president by the town of Moscow. Taft announced some days ago that he would not forsake Beverley, Mass., as his summer residence.

President Taft is also considering an invitation received from Governor M. E. Hay, of Washington, to visit that state.

POSTMASTER'S SALARIES ARE RAISED

Washington, June 6.—The following postmasters, with their present salaries, will receive an increase of \$100 per year beginning July 1: Oregon—Salem, \$3,100; Baker, \$2,500; Eugene, \$2,800; Grants Pass, \$2,400; Roseburg, \$2,400.

Medford, Oregon, is raised from \$2,600 to \$2,800 and Klamath Falls from \$2,200 to \$2,400.

HEROINE OF WRECK DIED TODAY

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Victoria, B. C., June 6.—Mrs. Minnie Patterson, the heroine of the Valencia disaster and Coloma wreck, died at Alberni Sunday. She made a memorable journey on December 8, 1906, over five miles of most difficult trail, in a heavy storm to send the government steamer Quadra from Bamfield after the storm had prostrated telegraph wires, to rescue Captain Allison and nine others who had abandoned hope when the bark Coloma, was being driven ashore at Cape Beale where she and her husband kept the lighthouse.

During the Valencia disaster she also won fame for her heroic work. Several medals were awarded her and the Canadian government gave her a silver service.

She never recovered from the privations suffered when she made the arduous trip which resulted in the crew of the Coloma being rescued.

POLICE FORCE IS TO HAVE A MOTORCYCLE

IT WILL BE USED IN CAPTURING VIOLATORS OF THE SPEED ORDINANCE. PERHAPS, ANYWAY IT CAN BE USED FOR THAT PURPOSE.

When the world was young and the common law held supreme reign there was a maxim which forbade an officer from shooting an offender of the law when he had committed an offense less than felony, commanding him, instead, to overtake and capture him, the law presuming in such cases the officer to be equally as fleet-footed as the escaping violator.

Now the law of today still forbids an officer shooting an offender when the crime committed is less than a felony, but in this day and age of the Oregon system and automobiles and aeroplanes, the presumption as to the fleetness of an officer no longer prevails, as is evidenced by the passage last evening by Salem's progressive and enterprising council of a resolution directing the police committee to purchase a motor-cycle for the benefit of the police force.

Automobiles Too Fast.

The reason advanced for the purchase of the motor-cycle is that the police force are unable to apprehend automobilists who may violate the speed ordinances. Whenever local parties are involved the officer can take the number of the machine and arrest them at their leisure, but when it comes to visiting automobilists speeding out of the city at a rate exceeding the specified rate in the speed ordinance, the number is of little value, as probably they will not visit the city again for months or for years, and it is necessary to apprehend them at the time of the offense. With a motor-cycle ready to be pressed into service, the police believe they will be able to apprehend all offenders.

Just who will be delegated to ride the wheel is not known, but it is understood that Night Patrolman Thompson is being groomed for the place.

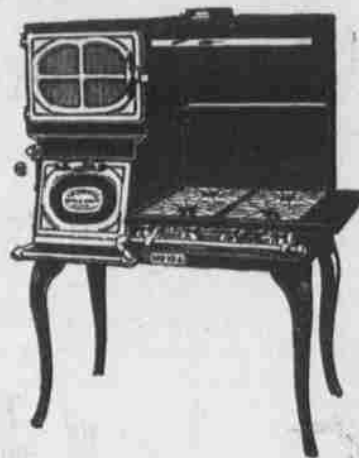
