"Notice is hereby given that the common council of the city of Salem, Oregon, will at or about 8 o'clock, p. m. on the 26th day of June, 1911, or at such time thereafter as may be convenient, at the common council chambers at Salem, Oregon, proceed to assess by an ordinance upon each lot or parcel of land deemed and considered by the council to be directly benefited, its proportionate share of the cost of the construction of the Union street sewer, and all persons interested therein are hereby notified that the assessment roll has been prepared under the direction of the council and is now on file at the office of the city recorder subject to the inspection of any person or persons interested therein, and that such assessment roll contains the property proposed to be assessed for the cost of the construction of such sewer, and that said property is generally included within the following limits: Commencing at the intersection of North Mill Creek with the Willamette River in the city of Salem, Marion county, state of Oregon; thence along said North Mill Creek easterly to block two (2) in Reed's Addition to the city of Salem, Oregon; thence along Thirteenth street to block six (6) in Robert's Addition to the city of Salem, Oregon; thence easterly on Chemeketa street to Fourteenth street; thence easterly through the center of alley between Court and Chemeketa streets to Mill creek; thence easterly on Chemeketa street to the state lands; thence southerly along the said state lands to Mill Creek; thence along Mill Creek to State street; thence westerly on State street to the Willamette river; thence northerly along the east bank of the Willamette River to the place of beginning.
