(Marion County not allowed to compete for this prize.)

**GRAND PRIZE.****Class L**

Special sterling silver cup valued at \$150 donated by Marion county for the best display of cherries, commercial pack, by any county, association or grower, to consist of not less than three varieties and not less than thirty ten-pound boxes. This cup must be won three times by the same county, association or grower before becoming the property of the winner. Contingents for this prize must state whether they desire the entry made in their own name or that of the county or association. This cup has been won once by Yamhill county, once by Lane county, once by S. P. Kimball, Polk county.

Second prize for best county exhibit of cherries, commercial pack, cash \$50.

Third prize for best county exhibit of cherries, commercial pack, cash \$25. Fourth, cash \$10.

**COMMERCIAL PACK.****Class 2.**

Best display of cherries, commercial pack, by any grower, dealer, or association. Ten-pound boxes only, not less than 20 boxes. First, \$25; second, \$10; third, \$5; fourth, diploma.

**Class 3.**

Best exhibitor of packed boxes by individual grower, 10-oz. more boxes First, \$10; second, \$5; third, cash \$2.00. Fourth, diploma. Entries in classes 1 and 2 not eligible to this class.

**Class 4.**

Seedling of merit. First, cup, value \$50 M McDonald. (Cup has been won four times.)

RULES GOVERNING EXHIBITS.

1. A plate of cherries or berries should contain one pound. Stems of cherries must be left intact.

2. Carbon exhibits must be entered and judged separate from the 10-pound box.

3. All fruits entered for prizes must be correctly labeled and must be in the hands of the exhibit committee before 8 a.m. of the opening day. All fruits will be judged and awards made before the doors are opened to the general public.

4. In collecting duplicate or varieties will not be permitted.

5. Exhibitors must file with the secretary on or before the 10th day of July, the fair name of the exhibit with complete list of varieties entered by him.

6. Entry cards furnished by the secretary must be placed with all exhibits for the guidance of the judges.

7. All exhibits must be free from the name or address or anything that would indicate where the fruit was grown or packed, until after awards are made.

8. All articles placed upon the tables for exhibition must remain in charge of the exhibit committee and cannot be removed before the close of the fair without express permission of this committee.

9. A judge or judges shall be appointed who shall judge all exhibits and in all cases the decision of their award shall be final. No judge shall be allowed to enter trial by competition.

10. In plate exhibits judges will consider size, shape, color, freedom from blemishes, taste, fragrance.

11. In carbonized exhibits judges will score according to the following:

10 points, uniform; 10 points, uniform; 10 points, quantity.

12. In addition to the prizes offered, all exhibitors will be paid 50 cents per box for unjudged boxes of cherries accepted for exhibition by the committee on exhibits, regardless of the fruit being thereby vested in the committee.

13. The committee on exhibits reserves the right to reject any fruit.

Exhibitors are requested to send a list of their exhibits to the secretary by July 5th, so that arrangements can be made. For programs or any further information address the secretary.

THE BABIES  
AND PRIZES**

BALLES FOR THE PARADE AND  
LIST OF PRIZES OFFERED FOR  
THE WINNERS IN THE GREAT  
EST SHOW ON EARTH.

The baby parade will take place at 11 o'clock Saturday, July 8, and will start on Court street opposite the Marion county court house. The line of march will be west on Court street to High street, south on High street to State street, east on State street to Cottage street, north on Cottage street and west on Court street to the place of starting. The half of the streets next to court house and intersection squares will be reserved and kept clear of traffic. It will not be necessary to cross any street or driveway, and in order to make it absolutely safe for the little ones, the whole line of march will be patrolled by a company of the state militia. The Beauty Show will take place immediately after the parade and will be held at the same place.

It is very important that the parade start on time, and it is the committee's intention to see that it starts at 11 o'clock sharp. The committee also wishes it distinctly understood that they will not assume the responsibility of acting as the judges. Judges for the Beauty Contest will be selected from out of town, it is planned. The parade judges' names will not be made public. They will be along the line of march and will hand in their decisions to the committee at the conclusion of the parade.
