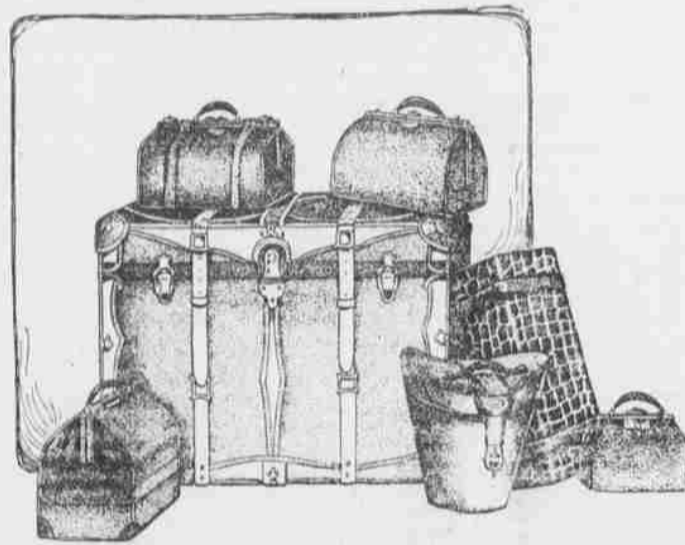

HAD A ROUGH TRIP NORTH FROM FRISCO

Portland, Ore., July 10.--Extremely rough weather was encountered on the trip up the coast from San Francisco by the steamer General Hubbard, Captain Ludlow, which arrived in port today. Waves came aboard, and tore up some of the deck planking, and the way from them crusted the funnel with salt clear to the top.

From the time the General Hubbard passed out beyond the heads at San Francisco she had a strong northwester to buck and a swell that was enormous. Seas coming over the fore-castle head and the weather of the steamer tore up the flooring over the decking, twisting the iron bands that held the planks down, and sweeping the steamer from end to end.

Aside from the planking, no serious damage was done, although it retarded the progress of the steamer to such an extent that she was 72 hours in making the trip up from San Francisco.
