

ROUTINE BUSINESS OF COUNCIL

CONTRACT FOR UNION STREET SEWER LET AT \$46,078.20—CITY ALSO BLOWS ITSELF FOR A CLOCK FOR COUNCIL CHAMBER.

The following routine business was transacted by the council last evening:

Eight per cent of the contract price for the improvement of East Court street—\$6195.22—was ordered paid the contractor, Edward Geiger.

W. D. Pugh received a balance of \$1600 on his contract for the improvement of North Commercial street.

Amended plans for the opening and widening of Seventeenth street from State to the fair grounds were adopted.

The petition of "Dad" Geier for an electric sign in front of his place of business was referred to the light committee, and so was the petition for a light at Shipping street and another at the Fair Grounds road.

The fire and water committee was authorized to purchase 200 feet of chemical hose.

The city recorder was instructed to notify the contractor who is paving Mission street that the work must be completed within the time prescribed in the contract, or the penalty would be enforced.

Edward W. Geizer presented a bill for extra work—cut street, in removing certain poles while paving the street, and it was ordered paid.

The committee on buildings reported that it had finally been successful in purchasing a clock for the city hall chamber, and that it hoped to have it installed by next Monday.

The same committee also recommended that the city, in buying fuel, purchase coal instead of wood, and 50 tons at \$7.50 a ton were ordered.

Twenty-five cords of wood for kindling purposes were ordered.

The contract for the installation of the Union street sewer was awarded to the John Construction company for \$46,078.20.

The ordinances providing for the improvement of East State and Front streets were passed.

WILL BUILD THE BRIDGE ON TWELFTH

Confident that if it can but convince the people that it is in earnest in the campaign for the reconstruction of the bridges in the city, and that if it can but assure it that their money will not be wasted, that it will be the strongest argument in favor of a bond issue, and that there will be an abundance of funds voted to rebuild the bridges in the city, the city council last evening voted to rebuild the bridge on Twelfth street near Oak.

Paul Leahy, the well-known bridge builder, will superintend the construction of this bridge, and he estimates that it can be built in the course of a month. Councilman Manning, chairman of the bridge committee, is back of the movement to build the bridge. Manning last evening, when the mayor desired to reconstruct the bridge bond issue contended that was time to set in repairing and rebuilding the bridges with the available money on hand, and when that was spent to appeal to the public, and show what had been done, and he is carrying his ideas in to execution in the construction of the Twelfth street bridge.

HE KICKED AT THE NAME OF ISRAEL

There are two young men living in adjoining houses out on the boulevard in North Salem. One is a street car conductor, the other is a painter, and both are married. They have known each other only for a short time, but each supposed the other to be sufficiently acquainted with the other to call his neighbor by his first name. Last night, however, the brush-wielder discovered his mistake.

The concern had just gotten on a good footing and was ready to go ahead on a larger scale when it burned down, March 23 last. Things looked pretty dark for the company then. But inside of 20 days, without any outside assistance, Mr. Scott was running again and turning out about 70 different styles of caskets in the United States. They sell to practically every undertaker in the state of Oregon, as well as a large number in Washington, Idaho, and California, as far south as San Francisco. The company uses about 20,000 feet of lumber a month, employs 11 people and is shipping about 130 caskets and as many rough boxes each month. They have more work than they can do with their present equipment and Mr. Scott says as fast as he can increase he will employ from 15 to 18 men.

The Journal feels that this illustration shows what perseverance and hard work can do in the face of most discouraging obstacles and the Willamette Manufacturing company is to be congratulated on the way it was pulled out of almost absolute ruin and placed itself on a paying basis.
