SUMMARY OF THE FIRE SITUATION

Forest fires in Oregon are being fought by an army of 525 men, while in Washington 75 men are battling with the flames. Despite their efforts the fires continue to spread and calls for more men have been sent out by the forest supervisors, who are conducting the work. Eighteen fires are reported beyond control in Umpqua Forest Reserve and an army of men are attempting to stop their spread. Molalla-Clackamas fire, eight miles long, is being fought by 200 men. Two fires in Santiam National Reserve are fought by 15 men. Seventy men battle with flames in reserve in Douglas county. Fire near Hot Springs, Wash., is fought by 75 men.
