of the speakers, and if enthusiasm and boosting speeches can be relied upon as a guide, it begins to look now as though the committee's plan to launch a campaign for the endowment fund which shall reach all four corners of the state, will be realized. T. S. McDaniel, president of the board of trustees, acted as toast-master and he wittily introduced the speakers. The first speaker of the evening was C. B. Moore, of Portland. He maintained that the school since its establishment had contributed at least five million dollars to

the city. He significantly compared this with the contributions made by the city of Salem for the institution.

Denouncing the rich high schools of learning for the intemperance and vice prevailing in them, Bishop Smith made an eloquent and masterful address.


"I seriously question," he said, "the usefulness of the wealthy institutions of higher learning and I was not surprised when I read Crane's attack upon them. The article may have been exaggerated but I warn you now that there was enough truth in it to challenge the attention of the nation. When you consider that the many sons of wealthy

men attending these institutions, have nothing to do but spend their money and have no responsibility so far as the future is concerned, it is not surprising to find conditions of intemperance and vice prevailing. Smoking, drinking, carousing and vice are characteristics of these institutions to an alarming degree and the hope of the young man today is the christian colleges."

"A campaign for an endowment of \$550,000" was the subject of the speech of Dr. Fletcher Homan, president of the school. There was an old endowment fund of \$125,000, he said; \$100,000 have been promised by Senator Booth; \$50,000 by James J. Hill, and \$80,000 has been sub-

scribed, making \$355,000, and leaving but \$195,000 to be raised. Thousands he stated, were already in sight.

Other speakers of the evening were: State Treasurer Kay, R. J. Hendricks, R. W. Raymond, of Portland, Rev. C. O. Kimball, of Walla Walla, Senator Booth, of Eugene, Congressman Hawley, Dr. Todd, and Dr. D. A. Hay, of the Garrett Biblical Institute.
