Witnesseth that: Whereas, Said Order is a fraternal beneficiary society, with a subordi-nat lodge system, and under its bylaws has issued and has now out-standing membership certificates providing for indemnity in case of death or disability and has also is-sued and has outstanding certain other certificates providing for sick and accident benefits, and

Whereas, Said Order is desirous of transferring or reinsuring its members holding said certificate provid-ing for death and disability indem-
