

FRANCHISE OBJECTIONS NUMEROUS

Should the committee on rules in whose hands is an ordinance introduced at the last session of the council granting a franchise to the Portland, Eugene & Eastern, fail to materially revise it and eliminate from it what are considered objectionable features, it is pretty safe to predict that it will never pass the council, and if it does pass the council, certain it is that it will not escape the veto of Mayor Lachmund.

The objections. Mayor Lachmund when the ordinance was given its second reading, outlined the objections he entertained to the franchise, and in the absence from the city of the chairman of the committee of ordinances referred to the committee on rules of which Councilman Eldridge is the chairman.

The first objection the mayor has to the franchise, is that according to its terms, it virtually grants a franchise to the Southern Pacific, as it is provided that should the Portland, Eugene & Eastern fail to comply with certain conditions, that the Southern Pacific may fulfill them.

Another feature is found in the provision that the franchise is granted to the Portland, Eugene & Eastern its successors and assigns. It is contended by the mayor that under this provision, the company is vested with full power to transfer or assign the franchise to the Southern Pacific or any one else.

Two other features which are meeting with objection are that it carries no penalty clause in the matter of the storage of cars, and that there is an absence of a provision to require the company to pave between the rails.

Changes Desired. The changes desired are that the Portland, Eugene & Eastern shall be made responsible for the failure to fulfill all conditions, and the insertion of a clause providing that in the event that it does fail to fulfill them that the franchise is forfeited. Another clause desired inserted is that the franchise shall not be transferable or assignable without the consent of the council.

No Report Monday. The committee will submit no report on the subject Monday—and will not submit a report on it until a conference can be had with the Oregon Electric people who also have a franchise on the same street where the Welch franchise is asked for—Front street. An effort was made to bring about such a conference yesterday afternoon but it failed and the committee will be unable to consult with the railroad company's officials now until next week.

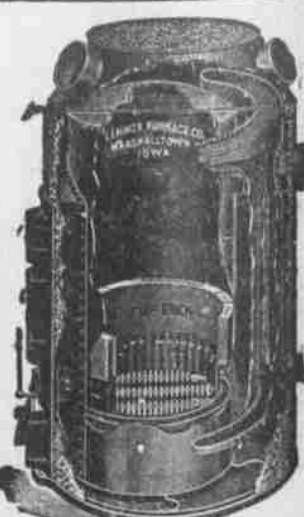
