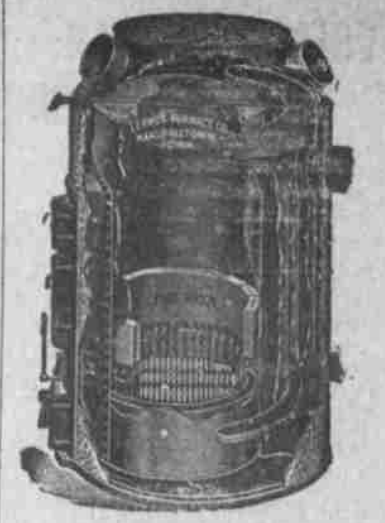

COMPANIES MUST AGREE ON ORDINANCE

When the committee to which was referred an ordinance granting a franchise to the Portland, Eugene & Eastern on Front street submits its report this evening on the matter to the council, it will recommend that the ordinance do not pass, and that the matter be entirely dropped until the railroad interests on this street can hold a conference and draft an ordinance which will be acceptable to them and also the city.
The committee held a conference with the representatives of the Oregon Electric, Portland, Eugene & Eastern and the Southern Pacific several days ago. The time was spent in wrangling, and the committee adjourned with the understanding that when the railroad people would agree upon an ordinance which would be satisfactory to them and the city, that the subject would be taken up again.
The point discussed was the common user clause. The Oregon Electric is willing to allow the Portland, Eugene & Eastern people to have common user privileges upon its

A FAMOUS CATHOLIC DIGNITARY

RIGHT REV. MONSIGNOR THOMAS CAPEL DIES VERY UNEXPECTEDLY AT SACRAMENTO LAST NIGHT.

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE] Sacramento, Oct. 23.—The right Rev. Monsignor Thomas John Capel, one of the best known prelates of the Roman Catholic church and distinguished on two continents for his eloquence and missionary activities, was found dead in bed this morning at the residence of Bishop Grace, where he had practically made his home for the past decade.
He retired last night after preaching the best of health and announced that he would say mass at 8:30 o'clock this morning. When he did not put in his appearance at the appointed hour, Father Ryan went to his room and found that he had peacefully passed away some time during the night.
Monsignor Thomas Capel was born in England on October 28, 1836, received his education in London and in Rome and began his eventful public life in devotion to the church by founding a training school for teachers, when but 17 years old. In 1872 he was made domestic prelate to Pope Pius IX. In 1874 he established a Roman Catholic University at Kensington. He is said to be the original of D'Israeli's character "Monsignor Catesby" in "Lothair."
He came to California 25 years ago and has been performing missionary work in Sacramento for the past 23 years.

MAY RESUME BALL GAMES TOMORROW

EXPLOSION IN MINES KILLS MANY

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE] Harrisburg, Ill., Oct. 23.—Thirty miners are reported imprisoned and probably many of them killed as a result of an explosion in O'Garra mine No. 9 here today.
Two bodies have been recovered and rescuers are battling desperately to reach the portions of the mine where the remainder are entombed. There is grave danger for the safety of the rescuers, who are braving death from falling walls in their efforts to rescue their entombed comrades.
Sixteen entombed miners are believed to be dead. The explosion occurred at the North main entrance of the mine, and is said to have been a discharge of powder.
At noon six rescuers, battling to recover the bodies from their suffocating prison, were brought to the surface unconscious and almost dead as a result of having inhaled the deadly fumes.
At 1 o'clock this afternoon eight bodies had been recovered of the 16 missing, with the rescue work still continuing, in spite of the danger from the deadly fumes.
