MEN FOR THE TAXPAYERS.

There is nothing to prevent making nominations for Aldermen by petition in addition to those nominated at the primary.

There are 15 days before the city election when names of candidates can be filed by petition.

That would be Friday at 5 p. m., according to the ruling of the city recorder on this matter.

After Friday at 5 p. m. names of candidates to get upon the official ballot cannot be presented.

If any citizens have a notion to put up anyone for Alderman, it must be done by petition before Friday at 5 p. m.

There should be a close scrutiny of the candidates now named and the interests of the taxpayer should not be overlooked.

City taxes have gone to the limit, and there are plans afoot to create new offices and heap up new burdens.

Why not try to elect men to unload some of the offices we now have and get rid of some of the present grafts?

Amendments to make new salaried offices should be smashed at the polls and so should all bonding schemes.

Let us get down to business once and apply business principles.

THE NON-PARTISAN PRIMARY.

At the coming city election the voters should take one plain common-sense step and establish the non-partisan primary.

The combined Des Moines and Tacoma non-partisan primary will do the trick and put us on a rational basis for a starter.

That is the plan that has been adopted at San Francisco and is a sane and rational proposition—almost too much to hope for at Salem.

Now you are compelled in city matters to register as a Republican or a Democrat in order to vote at the city primary.

That is a clear violation of the secrecy of the ballot in municipal affairs.

Let Salem strike the first blow to get rid of a Primary law that compels holding primaries on Saturday afternoon.

Just when you should have the business man and his employees at the primary election, they are shut out.

Next, the present law forces nominations where there should be no partisanship—in city affairs.

Let Salem strike the first blow for freedom from the U'Ren crazy-quilt election laws that now paralyze the best efforts of citizens.

Notice is hereby given that the common council of the city of Salem, Oregon, deems and considers it necessary and expedient and proposes to construct a sewer to be known as "Lateral Sewer District No. 5", and that there shall be laid eight-inch vitrified or concrete sewer pipe commencing at a point 50 feet from the north line of block 71, North Salem; thence southerly through the center of said block extending through an unnumbered block to Market street; thence to a manhole in the Oaks Addition sewer in the city of Salem, Oregon. Also, commencing at a point 50 feet from the north line of block 72, North Salem; thence southerly through center of said block and extending through an unnumbered block to Market street; thence to a manhole in the sewer in Oaks Addition to the city of Salem, Oregon; said sewer shall be constructed at the expense of the property directly benefited and according to the maps, plans and specifications adopted for the same and on file at the office of the city recorder, which said plans and specifications are hereby referred to for a more detailed description of said sewer.

WE SECURED AN EXPERT CIVIL ENGINEER TO PLAT OUR WHOLE TRACT, AND AS THE TREES WERE PLANTED LATER, ENGINEERS STAKED OUT EACH PLACE WHERE A TREE WAS TO SET, SO THOSE WHO NOW VIEW OUR ORCHARDS CAN STAND IN THE MIDST OF ANY TRACT AND SEE A STRAIGHT ROW OF TREES IN ANY DIRECTION. IN ONE TRACT YOU CAN SEE ROWS OF TREES A MILE LONG WITHOUT THE SLIGHTEST DEVIATION IN THE LINE. ROADS ARE ALSO LAID OUT, SO EACH FIVE-ACRE TRACT IS ON A ROADWAY, WHICH WILL BE PUT IN THE VERY BEST OF CONDITION.

AFTER THE LAND IS ALL PLATTED, LINED UP AND STAKED, THE WORK DURING THE FIVE YEARS WHICH IT TAKES TO BRING AN ORCHARD INTO PROFITABLE BEARING IS AS FOLLOWS.

FIRST YEAR. THE LAND IS PLOWED, SUBSOILED, HARROWED, LINED UP AND STAKED. THEN SIXTY-THREE HOLES, TWO FEET DEEP AND THREE FEET IN DIAMETER, ARE DUG. NEXT SIXTY-THREE TREES ARE CAREFULLY PLANTED AND PRUNED. THE TREES ARE WHITEWASHED AND SPRAYED TWO OR THREE TIMES. THE LAND IS CULTIVATED CONTINUOUSLY TILL FALL, SOWED WITH A COVER CROP OF VETCHES, AND SOWED WITH PLASTER.

SECOND YEAR. THE LAND IS PLOWED TWO WAYS, HOED AROUND THE TREES, CULTIVATED CONTINUOUSLY UNTIL FALL, SOWED WITH A COVER CROP OF VETCHES, OR COMMERCIAL FERTILIZER AND SOWED WITH PLASTER. THE TREES ARE WHITEWASHED ON THE TRUNKS TWICE, SPRAYED SUMMER AND FALL AND PRUNED INTO PERFECT SHAPE.

DURING THE THIRD, FOURTH AND FIFTH YEAR THE WORK IS EXACTLY THE SAME AS THE SECOND YEAR EXCEPT IN CASES WHERE THE CAREFUL HORTICULTURIST GOING THROUGH THE ORCHARDS STUDYING THE DEVELOPMENT OF EACH TREE FINDS THAT SOME EXTRA ATTENTION WOULD BE HELPFUL.
