INDEPENDENT GOOD CITIZENSHIP CITY TICKET

There will be an independent city ticket for alderman in each ward. The movement is under the direction of gentlemen prominent in prohibition circles, but will not be put out as a prohibition party ticket. About one-half the primary nominees will be endorsed, and the rest of the places filled by a committee composed of the following gentlemen:
Julius G. Vogel, chairman.
E. J. Lehman, secretary.
R. G. Miller, secretary of the county prohibition committee.
J. C. Robertson, A. J. Cook and Oliver Jory are the rest of the committee to determine on candidates. It is expected that all the acceptance of the candidates in each ward will be on file this evening on the following platform:
Independent Good Citizenship Platform.
1. We are unalterable opposed to licensing the sale of intoxicating beverages.
2. We favor such improved form of city government as will combine the highest type of efficiency with economy of administration.
3. We believe that in the interest of economy the city should do its own improvement work whenever expedient.
4. We favor the employment of home labor in all public improvement work as far as possible.
5. We favor a water system that will furnish an abundance of pure water at a reasonable rate.
6. We favor a curfew ordinance that will keep unaccompanied children off the streets at night, and hold parents or guardians responsible for them.
7. We favor such supervision of public rooming houses and of public places of amusement as will eliminate immoral features.
8. We favor an ordinance forbidding public improvement work on Sunday, except in cases of actual emergency.
