**Women Rush Police.**  
[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.]  
London, Nov. 21.—A suffragette raid on parliament this afternoon resulted in a pitched battle between the women and the police. For a time the police withstood the attack by the militant women, preventing them from entering the house of commons. More than 100 women were arrested during the first few minutes of rioting.

Many minor casualties occurred. The women resisting the police bitterly, and forcing them to use their clubs.

All the streets converging on the parliament buildings were jammed with suffragettes. Enough policemen were at the scene to quell a mon-

ster riot. The women became veritable viragos when efforts were made to turn back the head of the marching army, and attacked the police furiously.

The streets were soon littered with women's hats, capes and parts of their gowns. Thousands of women resorted to the most desperate tactics, hurling stones at the government buildings. Hundreds of persons were struck by the flying missiles, severe injuries resulting in some cases.

The women attempted to raid the houses of parliament tonight, announcing their intention of forcing their way into the house of commons and compelling Premier Asquith to reconsider his determination not to

make suffrage one of the issue of the administration.

**WOMEN MAY ELECT SOCIALIST MAYOR**  
Riverside, Cal., Nov. 21.—With the woman vote practically all cast by noon, indications at that hour were that L. E. Edmiston, socialist, would be elected mayor of Riverside. In addition to receiving the solid support of labor interests, Edmiston was strongly supported by the ranchers. A full city ticket is to be elected.

was informed that Rockefeller objected to his employees owning stock in his company. Rockefeller offered Martz \$25 a share for the stock. Martz sold it for \$30 a share.

The same stock now pays \$200 a year in dividends.

Alfred Merrill testified that by manipulating the coal loan, Rockefeller obtained, for less than \$1,000,000 ore property in the Mesaba range worth \$700,000,000.

Merrill testified also that F. B. Gates, manager of Rockefeller's charity work, induced him to put his ore holdings into the deal, and then, after the transaction was arranged, Rockefeller called in all loans and "froze him out."

Merrill was formerly president and one of the founders of the Duluth, Mesaba and Northern railroad.

**Old Rocky Will Have to Swear.**
