## CONDITIONS ON THE SOUND IMPROVED

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.]  
Seattle, Nov. 23.—After being paralyzed since Sunday on account of the floods, railroad traffic is again resumed. The Great Northern and Northern Pacific main lines have been opened and trains are running under caution signals.

Interurban traffic is now open again between Seattle and Tacoma. The Chicago, Milwaukee and Puget Sound railroad lines are so badly washed out that they will not be restored for a week, but that line is operating over the Northern Pacific as far as Easton.

Renton, Earlinton, Kent and other valley towns near here are still under water, but conditions are improving and ranchers have begun to return to their homes. The damage has exceeded \$100,000 to crops and ranches alone.

### SALEM BOARD OF EDUCATION

(Continued from Page 1.)

the superintendent is to continue to have this responsibility, he desires the full co-operation of the board and its committee in the matter. Otherwise, he desires to be relieved of the responsibility.

2. Another regulation of the board states that the superintendent shall have general supervision over all the schools; that he shall make frequent visits to each room and inspect the methods of teachers in discipline and instruction; that he shall give special attention to defects and shall suggest remedies for the same; that he shall have power to call meetings of all, or of part of the teachers at such times and places as he shall deem expedient; that unless excused or otherwise instructed by the chairman, he shall attend all regular and special meetings of the board; and, that he shall make monthly, annual, and all other reports required by the board.

It will be noted that the above duties of the superintendent apply to all the schools in the district, and this includes the high school. In a city of the size of Salem, the superintendent is able to give more attention to the work of the schools than in larger cities. The larger the city, the more impossible it becomes for the superintendent to give attention to details. But in all cities, large or small, the general duties, as outlined above are assigned to the superintendent. It is the superintendent who recommends the appointment of teachers, and outlines the general policies of the schools, subject to the approval of the school board. The above are the duties that have governed the present superintendent in his official actions during the last six years. He desires to know at this meeting, or at any rate, as soon as possible, whether the present board desires to modify, amplify, or abridge the above duties of the superintendent.

Supt. Powers in Charge.  
"Be it resolved, that the superintendent give all directions concerning the high school to and through the principal thereof. The principal of the high schools is to receive and accept such directions from the superintendent and to transmit them to his teachers and work them out in good faith. He is further to have regular department meetings, notice of which he is to give to the superintendent. The teachers of the high school are at work under the direction and authority of the principal thereof."

the Moore mansion in San Mateo, got out of the witness stand and gave a very good imitation of a "drunk" in testifying that he had seen Mrs. Lillian L. Moore in that condition.

Sumimura was giving his testimony through an interpreter. When he declared that he had seen Mrs. Moore intoxicated, Attorney E. H. McClanahan questioned his understanding of the word. To illustrate he got up and staggered about the witness box. His acting satisfied all concerned that he knew what he was talking about.

The Japanese said that on several occasions he had "smelled liquor on Mrs. Moore's breath." Then Judge Buck declared that he did not care about how much liquor was on anyone's breath in this case—the question was one of whether or not the person was drunk.

It is expected that Moore himself will take the stand late this afternoon to tell his side of the story of war and battle which marred the family life in the millionaire's home.
