Clark Pardoned—

At the request of Captain Ryan, of the Salvation Army, W. E. Clark, who was recently sentenced to jail for 25 days for disturbing a Salvation Army meeting, was today given a conditional pardon by Governor West. The I. W. W. say they do not endorse Clark's methods and will hereafter do their own talking and without indulging in abuse. Besides this they volunteered the information that if Clark had not been pardoned, some 200 of them had arranged to do something to get into jail, and so pass the matter up to the county to act.

Cleaned Out Council.

Clatskanie, Or., Nov. 23.—Angry at the city fathers because his property at Clatskanie had been assessed at a valuation he believed too high, Walter Pulliam, six feet three, "cleaned out" the council which was in session when he appeared.

He tackled the mayor first and sent him to the floor with a swing to the jaw; the recorder came next; then Pulliam hurled a councilman out of the window. Meanwhile the other officials fled. Pulliam was charged with assault and battery today.
