Ed. Journal:—As a reader of your paper I am also interested in an open communication in your paper of recent date in regard to 16 miles of cement walks.

At the present time we have 1,425 feet of four-foot wide, plank walk and about 500 feet of cement walk on the west side of Saginaw street and we were the first to petition for a walk after coming into the city limits.

On the east side of street there is 180 feet of walk between Mission and the southern boundary, then why three blocks of cement walk on one side of street and nothing on the other? Give us a good plank walk on both sides of the street from Mission to Washington, four feet wide and the street will look much better and will be fair for everybody and when our walks wear out, we can replace them with concrete as I for one, intend to do and there are others who
