state or its grantee, the occupancy of the plaintiff under his contract for the purchase of the land, was that of a tenant, and did not inure to the benefit of the plaintiff, but to the benefit of the state, for the purpose of perfecting title by adverse possession; Anderson v. McCormiek, 18 Or. 301-303; Rowland v. Williams, 23 Or. 515, 523; 1 Cyc, 1004; Mabary v. Dollarhide, 14 Am. St. Rep. 639; McAuliffe v. Parker, (Wash.) 38 Pac. 744.

It is clearly shown in the testimony that the state of Oregon through plaintiff Stephenson, its vendee, under the contract for the purchase of the land, was in the open, notorious, exclusive and adverse possession of the land, under color of title from August 21, 1882, until December, 1898, more than the statutory period crued by such possession of plaintiff inured to the benefit of the state from which defendant Van Blokland deraigns title.

From the record and evidence on the part of plaintiff, as well as that of defendant, we think that plaintiff has failed to sustain the allegation of his complaint as to adverse possession of the land for the statutory period, and as between the parties of this suit, that defendant is the owner in fee, and entitled to the possession of the whole of the land.
