Pass Resolutions—State Superintendent of Public Instruction Alderman is in receipt of resolutions passed by the school officers, convention recently held at Dallas, in which his plan to have congress set aside the lands given to the Southern Pacific by a grant for the public schools is endorsed. Suit was instituted in the federal courts for the cancellation of the title to these lands, and a judgment rendered in favor of the government. The case is now on appeal before the supreme court. Practically every institute held in the state so far has passed resolutions endorsing the plan.

HABEAS CORPUS CASE HEARD AT ALBANY

Albany, Ore., Dec. 14.—The habeas corpus proceedings to prevent requisition of the person of one Green, commercial traveler, who is wanted in Washington for neglect to support a wife and child, who are divorced, were heard in argument today before Judge Galloway. Deputy District Attorney Gale S. Hill appeared for the state and M. V. Weatherford for Green.

G. A. FROHMADER IS BADLY HURT

G. A. Frohmader was badly injured today in a cave-in under the Dr. Steeves building on State street, where excavations are being made, preparatory to a general remodeling of the structure. Frohmader was engaged at the time with another workman in load in the wagon, and was standing beside it. Because of the weight of the building on the bank where the excavation was being done it gave way, and both men were hurled for 10 feet or more. Frohmader was thrown against the wagon, and, while the attending physician gave it as his opinion that no bones were injured, he expressed fears of grave internal injuries.
