M'MANIGAL STARTS EAST NEXT MONDAY

(UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.) Los Angeles, Dec. 16.—Arrangements for the transfer of Ortle E. McManigal to Indianapolis, where he will be the principal witness before the federal grand jury investigating an alleged nation-wide dynamite conspiracy, were completed here today. Accompanied by Detective Malcolm McLaren, of the Burns Agency, and a score of federal officers, McManigal will be hustled out of the city Monday night in an automobile to a neighboring town and there will be put aboard a special car on an east-bound train. The exact route to be taken by the officers and the famous witness is being carefully guarded, as demonstrations are feared if this becomes known.
