## BURKHARDT DOES FINE BIT OF SLEUTH WORK

TRACES ENDORSEMENT OF THE CHECK TO BERT WARFORD AND ARRESTS HIM IN PORTLAND—OFFICER DOES SOME CLEVER SLEUTH WORK AND LOGICAL REASONING THAT GETS HIS MAN.

When Day Officer Burkhardt Saturday evening arrested Bert Warford, former mailing clerk at the state house during the legislature, just as he was entering the Imperial Hotel, at Portland, he completed as clever a piece of detective work as has ever been executed in this city.

Warford is charged with extracting from the mail a check belonging to Miss Elizabeth Lord, and yesterday afternoon practically confessed to the officers. The check was sent to Miss Lord by Frank Meredith, secretary of the State Fair Board, to cover a premium of \$15 for flowers she had on exhibition during the fair. Miss Lord never received it, but in the course of time it came back to the secretary apparently properly endorsed by her, and also containing the endorsement of Bert Chimm. A few months ago the case was turned over to Officer Burkhardt. Learning that Warford had been entrusted with the duty of mailing the letter containing the check, his suspicions were directed toward him. He secured samples of his handwriting, and it resembled so strongly the endorsement on the check, that he decided to arrest him.

Warford, when confronted with the charge maintained that he was innocent, but afterwards admitted his guilt, and offered to settle provided the case against him would be dropped.

## The Doctor's Answers On Health and Beauty Questions

K. O.:—I judge from your letter that you have led a very unhappy life, and now that you are married, sickness intervenes to destroy your new found contentment. Your symptoms indicate a disordered liver and are repeated here for the benefit of others: Drowsiness, weakness, languor, especially after eating, nervousness, headache, floating specks, dizziness, sallow complexion, constipation, irritability, etc. For malaria or disordered liver and bowels this prescription may be relied upon when properly filled by a honest druggist: Fluid ext. mandrake 3 drams, essence mentha-lacinae, 2 1/2 oz., glycerine 6 ozs. Mix. Always shake bottle and take a teaspoonful every hour or two hours through the day.

John K.:—Your devotion to your wife and your anxiety for her welfare are commendable; but her trouble is not serious now, but will become so if neglected. Her symptoms being those of indigestion and dyspepsia, are pains under the shoulders, heart palpitation, shortness of breath after eating, belching, gas and heavy feeling in the stomach. For quick relief, obtain a package of tablets triopetine and take pink after breakfast, white after dinner and blue after supper. As a tonic, restorative, take a teaspoonful before meals of the following: Compound syrup hypophosphites 6 ozs., tincture cadomene compound 1 oz. Mix. Continue six to eight weeks.

Bad Teeth.—You should consult a good dentist even if you have only two bad teeth. As you say, tooth powders and pastes are expensive, but you can make enough of the very best to last your whole family a year or more at a trifling cost compared with labeled goods. The following formula can be mixed by anyone and will prevent decay, cleanse, purify and remove accumulations of "tartar" and discolorations of tobacco, berries, etc. Get 5 ozs. precipitated chalk, 3 ozs. powdered sugar, 1 oz. powdered soap and 2 ozs. antiseptic vilane powder. Mix thoroughly and keep dry. Apply with toothbrush one or more times daily.

I. R. B.:—I must thank you for your kind words of appreciation. I was certain you would find a cure for dandruff in plain yellow minyol, which I always recommend.
