[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Portland, Or., Feb. 10.—Hounded by a firm of loan sharks who collected \$120 of his salary of \$200 in the last two months, Louis Simson, a fireman, today faces a rock pile sentence because he was unable to pay alimony due his wife as a result. Two years ago Simson borrowed \$50 to tide him over a financial difficulty. Since then he has paid the so-called banking firm \$220 and still owes \$55 on the principal. When his wife had him arrested for non-support, it was learned that Simson was unable to pay alimony because the so-called banking firm wanted its interest and attached his salary through a power of attorney the concern held.

A KENTUCKY BAD MAN SHOT BY SHERIFF

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Pikeville, Ky., Feb. 10.—As a result of the killing today of Louis Hall, who himself boasted of taking 23 lives, and Morgan Hall, his son, another feud war is feared in the Big Sandy valley. Hall was shot by Constable George Johnson. Johnson was reading a warrant for arrest, charging Hall with operating a "blind tiger," when Hall showed signs of resistance and was shot.

ARIZONA GETS GOVERNOR AS A VALENTINE

Globe, Ariz., Feb. 10.—Governor-elect Hunt will be inaugurated at Phoenix, February 14, the day that Arizona becomes a state. This announcement was today following the receipt of news from Washington that President Taft would sign the proclamation of admission on that day. Hunt stated that the inauguration would be conducted simply and that there would be no set program.

PORTUGAL DAMAGED BY SEVERE FLOODS

Lisbon, Feb. 10.—Several coasting vessels driven to sea by the flood raging through Portugal are reported lost today, and many barges are missing. Inundation by water at Leixoes has caused \$1,000,000 damage, and the city of Oporto is reported distressed.

Coldest in Six Years.

Detroit, Feb. 10.—Detroit experienced today the coldest weather in six years. The thermometer registered 11 below zero here, and other lake points report even more severe weather.

At Saginaw and Sault St Marie 32 below was registered; Houghton and Lansing, 24; Alpena, 23, and Marquette, 18 degrees below zero.
