San Francisco, Feb. 13.—Warring Chinese tongs here have prepared to sign an armistice until March 7. Representatives of the tongs meet at

the offices of the Six Companies this afternoon to sign the pact. This insures peace in Chinatown through the Chinese New Year festivities at least.

Had the pact not been agreed upon in answer to Chief of Police White's ultimatum, the authorities would have blockaded Chinatown. All tourists and non-residents of the Chinese colony would have been kept out and thousands of dollars worth of trade would have been lost.

Henry Stevens Chamberlain, born in 1843 in Manchester, Vermont, his life-long home till last September, passed away quietly and peacefully early Sunday morning, February 11, in the presence of his immediate family. He leaves to mourn him a widow, Mrs. Harriet Landon Chamberlain, a daughter, Clara M. Chamberlain and a host of relatives and friends in East and West. Miss Chamberlain has taught in the West for four years, the last two of which have been spent in Salem. The past summer Miss Chamberlain returned to her native state, Vermont and in the fall brought back her father and mother to spend the year with her in Salem. Mr. and Mrs. Chamberlain soon loved the beauties and charms of the West and life for all seemed happy and vigorous. An old trouble of Mr. Chamberlain's, hardening of the arteries, after long development, suddenly reached a crisis, when he had enjoyed but a few months in the West, and death came to claim and remove him in the 68th year of a full and vigorous life.

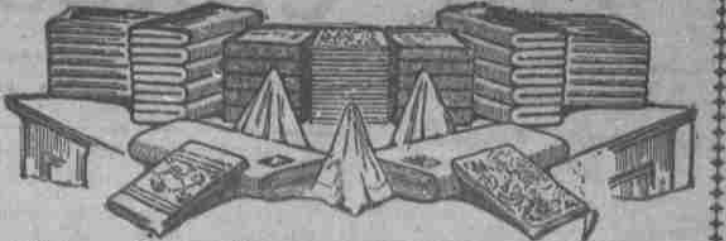
