TWO OREGON WOMEN ARE MURDERED

MAY VISITING CAMP IS DRIVEN AWAY AT POINT OF GUN—FROM HILL WATCHES MURDERER BURY VICTIMS' BODIES.

Riverside, Cal., March 20.—Held on suspicion of having murdered Mrs. Harriet Guyot, aged 58, of 22 Monteville street, Portland, Or., and Miss Julia Francois, aged 19, of The Dalles, Ore., Frank Baurwaerts is under arrest here today, and deputy sheriffs have been sent to a camp in the Chuckwalla mountains where he is alleged to have buried the bodies. Baurwaerts, who is a Belgian, was arrested early today at Imperial Junction, where he was about to board a Southern Pacific eastbound train. The arrest followed the receipt of a telegram signed by M. D. C. Butman, a prospector, who claimed he saw the man bury the bodies of his alleged victims. Officers were sent at once to Imperial Junction, to which point Baurwaerts had made his way from his camp in the mountains. The man has refused to discuss the case. According to information given by Butman, the two women recently advanced \$1000, with which Baurwaerts was to develop mining property he had located in the Chuckwallas, 30 miles from Iris, a Southern Pacific desert tank station. The women accompanied him to the claim, where they pitched camp. Last Sunday afternoon Butman journeyed from his camp, two miles away, to talk with his neighbors, Davies and others against the city of Baurwaerts, he said, drove him from the place at the point of a rifle. Butman ascended a hill a mile away, ac-

ording to his statement to the police, saw Baurwaerts bury the women's bodies. He tramped over the desert to Iris, where he wired the authorities here. Officers left Riverside today to search for the bodies. Butman accompanied them. Baurwaerts had \$175 in his possession when arrested.

Story Partly Confirmed. Portland, Ore., March 20.—A special dispatch to the Journal from The Dalles, Ore., says: "Julia Francois was a Belgian girl, whose home was two and one-half miles from The Dalles, on Mill creek. She was the daughter of Hector Francois, a truck gardener. The family came here in February, 1910, from Vancouver, B. C. She was 19 years old. There are several younger children."

STATE WINS FAMOUS KATE THOMPSON CASE Olympia, Wash., March 20.—The state of Washington owns title to the lands involved in the famous Kate Thompson case, according to notice received here from the interior department. The case, begun in 1897 and fought through the courts, settled the question whether a person who decided to settle on land could claim a preference right after the state had filed a selection list. Miss Thompson, a school teacher, won in every instance until this last decision. The state will get about 1,000 acres for its school fund.

BOTH SIDES AGAINST MINIMUM WAGE BILL

[UNITED PRESS LEADERS WIRE.] London, March 20.—Meeting in secret conference here today, committees representing the coal miners and the mine operators both condemned the minimum wage bill, declaring that it defeats its own purpose. The operators stated they have no guarantee that the miners will fulfill the bill's provisions. The government forces expect to pass the bill and secure the signature of King George to it on Saturday.

STREET CAR AND ELECTRIC COLLIDE

A collision occurred at noon today at the corner of High and State streets between a street car and the construction train of the Oregon Electric railroad. The street car was going west and the train north. Both of them stopped, as is the custom at an intersection and the car started at the same time as the train, but before either could be stopped they had collided, the car being forced off the track. The train struck the car about the center with such force that one of the passengers, Mrs. F. Watson, was pretty badly shaken up and her wrist bruised badly. No one else was injured in the accident, and the car was but slightly damaged.

Ormsby McHarg Coming. [UNITED PRESS LEADERS WIRE.] Portland, Ore., March 20.—Ormsby McHarg, prominent supporter of Colonel Roosevelt, will come to Oregon and Washington soon to work in the interest of Roosevelt. It was announced today. R. P. Hudson, of Chicago, another Roosevelt follower, will also be in Oregon and Washington in a day or two to further Roosevelt's campaign. Thomas McCuaker, head of the La Follette campaign in Oregon, said today that he would nip in the bud any movement to unite Oregon progressives for Roosevelt, as it is rumored Hudson and McHarg will try to do.

Refused to Comment.

[UNITED PRESS LEADERS WIRE.] Trenton, N. J., March 20.—President Taft read Colonel Roosevelt's reply here today to his Boston speech, but refused to make any comment on it. Later he conferred with Secretary Meyer. It is believed a war of bitter personalities between Taft and Roosevelt will follow the attacks already delivered.

Two Mysterious Deaths.

Naples, March 20.—Marches Salvatore Volpicelli and an unidentified American woman were found dead in a room here today at the Hotel Resurgimento. Death in each instance was due to revolver wounds. The police are investigating. The woman resided at the Hotel Excelsior, but the management refused to reveal her name. Volpicelli was a member of a prominent Naples family.

Tacoma, March 20.—John Early, alleged leper, whose presence in Summit View, near here aroused bitter protest, may go away.

C. W. BUCKNER INJURED IN RUNAWAY

Mr. C. W. Buckner, of this city, was quite seriously injured last week in a runaway accident on his farm at Marston. He was just starting the hired man to plowing, and, as the plow was not properly adjusted, he stepped to the doubletrees to make some adjustments in the clevis, when one of the horses started to back, and in some way the team became entangled in the harness, and started to run away, taking Mr. Buckner, who was also caught in the tangle, along. He finally succeeded in freeing himself, but his right leg was injured. He did not give it much attention for a few days, but, on coming to Salem, a few days later, he called on Dr. Fisher, and the doctor suggested going to the hospital. He accordingly was taken to the Willamette sanatorium, and yesterday Dr. Fisher operated on the limb, and found that one of the arteries of his leg was ruptured, and that a great quantity of clotted blood had accumulated. The clotted blood was removed, the wound dressed, and he is doing nicely.

Mr. Buckner considers himself fortunate in not being injured any more seriously than he was, but as it is he will be in the sanitarium several days.
