## TRAINS TO EUGENE IN SEPTEMBER

**CONTRACT CLOSED FOR BRIDGES ACROSS WILLAMETTE AND THE SANTIAM ON EXTENSION OF THE OREGON ELECTRIC TO EUGENE.**

Contracts were closed at Portland yesterday by the Oregon Electric Railway company with the Union Bridge & Construction company, whereby the latter will build three crossings for the electric line on its extension from Salem to Eugene.

The principal structure will span the Willamette River at Harrisburg and the second in size will be across the Santiam, the remainder of the contract being in connection with less important work.

**Piers to Be Planned.**  
L. S. Stewart, president of the construction corporation, has arrived at Portland from Kansas City. He will be followed this week by Harry K. Seltzer, engineer of construction of the company. Tom Alexander, resident engineer, has proceeded to Harrisburg to view the scene of operations and will be in the city tomorrow. On the arrival of Mr. Seltzer, plans will be started immediately for the piers, of which there will be 16 for all bridges and they will be built with cofferdams.

It is the intention to have the steel work completed so that through trains can be operated from Portland to Eugene in September and it is not thought that there will be material interference because of high water in the Willamette. The Harrisburg bridge will be south of the ordinary head of navigation, except for small vessels, as the steamers of the Oregon City Transportation company proceed to Corvallis and when water conditions are of the best, make special trips to Peoria.

**Most Equipment Goes by Rail.**  
Some of the material for the Santiam bridge will be handled by water route, but heavy equipment will go by rail and as the Oregon Electric is hurrying the new work, deliveries can be made without the necessity of hauling by teams a great distance.

The Union Bridge & Construction company built the foundations for the new Harriman bridge, which is to replace the steel bridge. The Harriman structure will be thrown open to the public about June. The Union Bridge & Construction company also built the foundations for the Broadway bridge, which included the piers in the river, all pedestals on land and the abutments. A final settlement was made by the city a few days ago and the contract has been accepted. The steel work is to be prosecuted by the Pennsylvania Steel company and should be started shortly, as the first delivery of material will be made as soon as possible, and the approaches and spans extending to the draw opening will be hurried.

### SOME FARMERS.

Endorses Journal Road Views.

Ed. Journal: I wish to congratulate you for your excellent article upon the subject of public roads, published a few days ago.

You have a clear, comprehensive grasp of the growth, development and permanency of the present system of improvement under our county courts and district supervisors. And in advocating the further up-building and continued development of the present system; and looking forward towards its future development, providing for a state system of highways, you are getting down to sound logical and practical sense upon the subject.

If the impractical good roads theorists of our cities could only realize the truthfulness of your statements about their theories being rot and tommy-rot as you define it; and cease making confusions and mispending their efforts through misleading agitation; it would prove of great benefit to the cause of good roads.

As it is, they are hindering instead of helping in the work. If the city automobile owners want to help maintain our roads, and encourage the farmers to do more toward road building, they should draft and secure the passage of a law, regulating the speed gears of automobiles and motor cycles; providing for a speed-gear limit of about 20 miles an hour. Such a law will be passed some time in the future; and if its passage is

delayed too long, it will be more drastic when it does come; so those that own automobiles that do not wish their speed-power excessively regulated, should act without delay.

I agree with you as to the amount the state should first appropriate toward road improvements; but disagree with you as to how it should be expended.

To my mind the important part for the state to do is to acquire the ownership of, and begin developing as many available gravel bars and rock ledges upon our rivers and streams, especially navigable streams, as it is possible.

It is state conservation of natural resources used in road surfacing, and state aid in preparing and making such material available, at reduced cost and at all seasons of the year that is needed; and not actual construction. If such was provided for, the counties and local districts will be able to provide for the grading and surfacing work.

Some time in the near future I will try and write an article along these lines, and attempt to show how suitable surfacing material and drainage and sewer pipe could be prepared by the federal, state, counties and cities' governments working co-operatively, at greatly reduced cost; and making it so easily obtained, that it would greatly stimulate and encourage road improvement work.

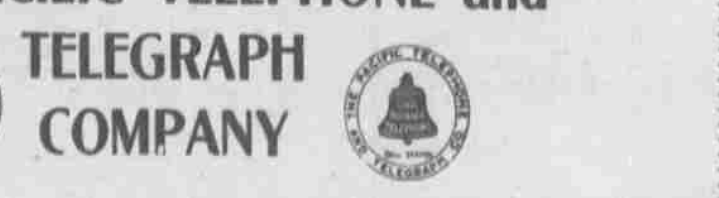
